

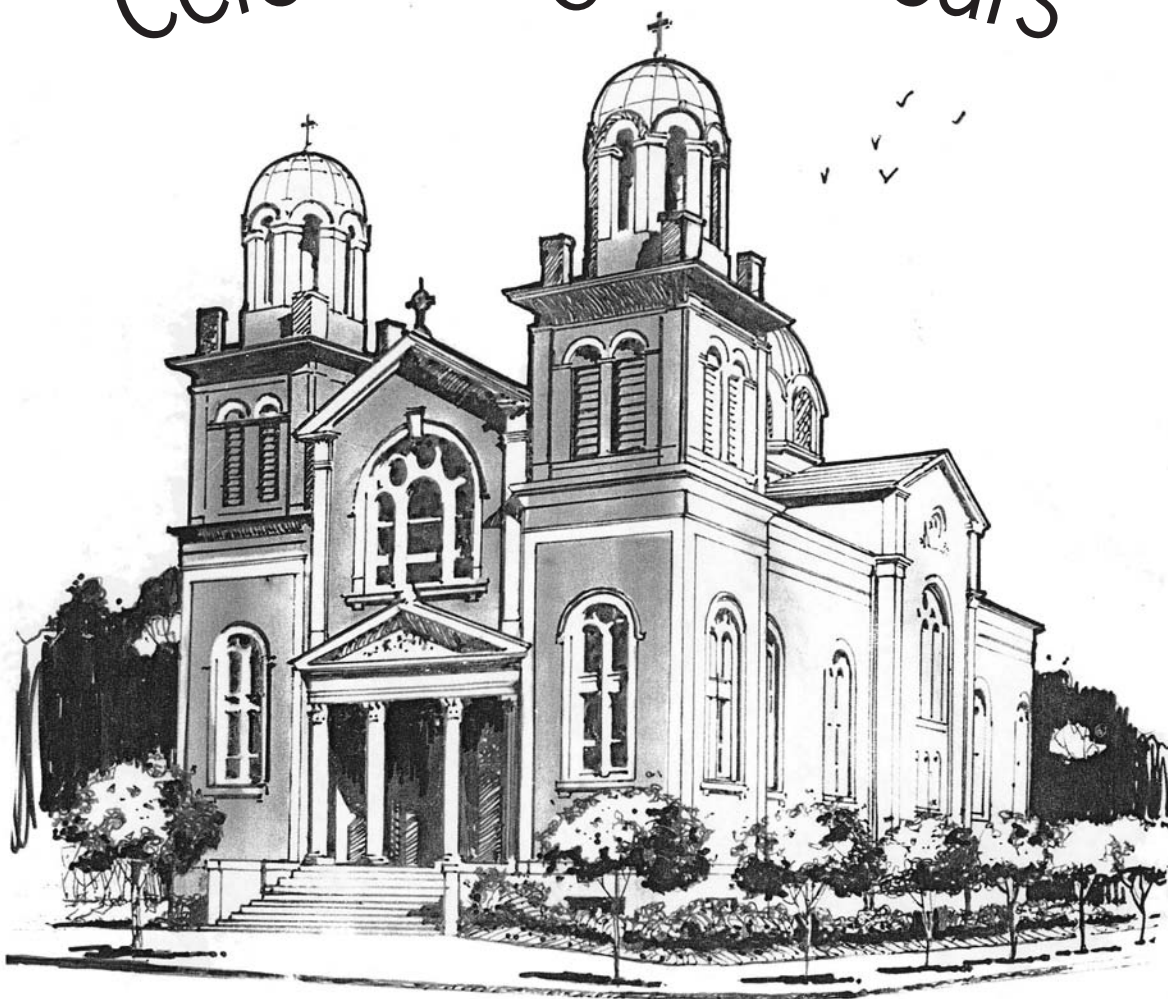

Dear Parish Family,

As I write this message to you November is upon us. Each November we, as a nation, and as individuals, gather in order to celebrate our national holiday of Thanksgiving. As a child and as an adult I have always loved Thanksgiving. Growing up my family lived relatively close to one another and we did see each other often but there was still something different about this particular gathering. What was different was the smells and sounds. The smell of turkey and pies, the sound of laughter, football games, and joy was all over the house. That day was truly a day to give thanks. There is a question we must consider though, what do we do with thanksgiving when it ends?

The answer to that question can be found in another gathering of Thanksgiving that we participate in. The gathering I am talking about is the Divine Liturgy. In the Divine Liturgy we gather as a family. It is different from other Church events because of what we hear, see and taste. We hear the sounds of Church music. We smell the incense and we receive Christ both through the Gospel lesson and through Communion. We must remember that when the service ends and we prepare to leave is when the work of the liturgy begins. Someone once wrote, "The work of the Liturgy is not begun until the Liturgy is concluded... We will leave the Liturgy and bring the conscience of faith into the world." When the liturgy ends is when the work begins. We take what we have received and go out into the world. When the holiday of Thanksgiving ends is when we need to take the feelings of joy and thankfulness with us as well.

My family in Christ, there is great benefit to be found in celebrating the Holiday of Thanksgiving. There is even greater benefit if we remember to take that joy with us after the celebration is complete.

Once again, we've included a monthly memory submitted by one of our parishioners. This is a continuation of the memory booklet that you received at our kick-off brunch. Please enjoy the following memory and consider submitting a memory from your family as well!

***Eldora (Elpetha Papameris) Pappas Brogan
born on June 26, 1938.***

Baptized at Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral in August, 1938. Parents Nicholas and Irene (Metraka) Pappas (Papameris). They were married in Thessaloniki, Greece July 25, 1924. My sister, Rose Pappas Skoulis, wife of Peter Skoulis, was born in Thessaloniki April 28, 1926 (as was Pete, my brother in law only on April 1, 1925) My mother and Rosie came to the U.S. to join my father in 1928.

My father went to Bowling Green, Ohio as a very young man, opened the first ice cream store across what is now BGSU and played on their very first football team as they did not have enough players at the school. After that, he opened up the Majestic Pool Room in downtown Toledo. He helped build the steps of our Church.

My mother, Irene, and sisters, Rose and Frieda (born in Toledo, July 30, 1936) were very active with the first and continuing years of the Greek-American Festival. My mother made the Diples and keftethes all three days of the festival for as long as she was able with the help of many of the parishioners. Rosie was active in the Maids of Athens, Daughters of Penelope and became District Governor of the Daughters and held various positions in the church community. Pete Skoulis, my brother in law, was active on the Church Board and

AHEPA with the culmination being the District Governor.

My sister, Frieda dedicated her life to our Church until she married in her mid-forties. Sunday school, Greek school, choir, GOYA, advisor to GOYA, advisor to Maids of Athens and a founding member of the volunteers to the Hellenic Echo (OWL) (as were Rose and Pete). Together, the volunteers met at Manton's Restaurant downtown for food and socializing. And, of course, the whole family was part of the Tenedian Brotherhood.

My involvement in the Church was my life! Frieda, Bill Kakmis, Helen Lados, and Elaine Markopoulos and I have many wonderful memories. Our house would be filled with many Greek relatives and "patrioties" after Church for name's day gatherings as we lived two blocks north of the Church. Many would walk over from Church services for some great food my mom prepared. Another significant memory is when I attended Greek School. I decided when I was about 12 years old that because my sister, Frieda graduated from Greek School that I simply was not going to attend any more Greek School. Walking home from school, I told Frieda that I was going home and telling our mother that I wasn't going to go to Greek School any more. Frieda said, "Don't do it." Of course, I did not listen to my sister and walked in and told my mother just that, I was never going back to Greek school tomorrow or ever." My mother looked down and did not say a word. Frieda said, "Did you do it?" I said, "Yes and she didn't say a word." WELL, the next day was Greek school and I quickly came home and changed into my play clothes when I got home. As I was coming down the stairs, the doorbell rang. It was the sheriff!! He said, "Hi, are you Eldora?" I said yes. He said, "I'm here to give you a ride to Greek School. Are you ready to go?" I said, "Yes, I'll just get my book." I looked at my mother and she was smiling and blew me a kiss! My mother had called Father Pappas and told him of my latest. He called his friend, a sheriff to request he pick me up and deliver me to Greek School. That solved my problem about quitting Greek School. I graduated with my class!

Since then, my involvement with my Church has been with HYO, Maids of Athens, Daughters of Penelope, Philoptochos, Choir, Sunday School Teacher, Advisor to GOYA and my husband was superintendent of the Church's Girls Basketball league. Currently, I volunteer serving and help preparing Makaria lunches for our funerals, volunteer for the Greek Kitchen, volunteer for the annual Greek-Am. Festivals and serve on the committee of the Parish Audit Committee.

Anastacia, Jenifer, and Rebecca, my three daughters, were born and baptized in Toledo. They grew up active in Sunday school, GOYA, and our Church's girls' Basketball League until we moved to Indianapolis and Charlotte, NC. When we returned each of the girls

was married after graduating from OSU and UT. They miss the closeness of our family and the great times we had with my parents, Rose and Pete's family (Malla & Nicky), and their wonderful Aunt Frieda. They are scattered around the globe and Al and I are kept very busy traveling around seeing them with their families as well as seeing Al's family.
