

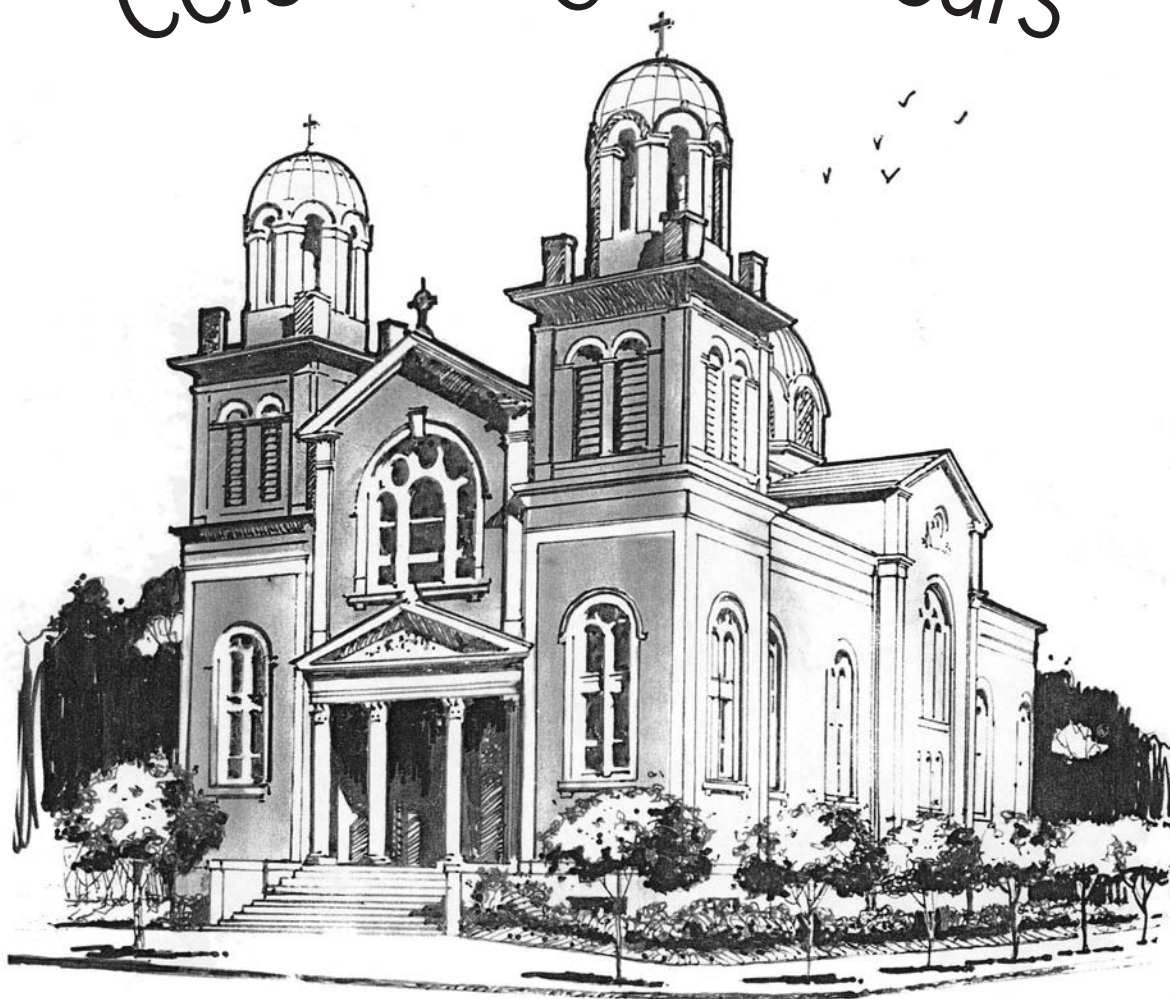

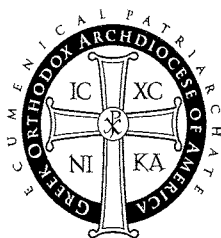

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

One of the most well-known scenes in the resurrection narratives is of course the Myrrh Bearing women discovering the empty tomb. "And when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the door of the tomb?" And looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back; for it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe; and they were amazed. And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, he is not here; see the place where they laid him." The Myrrh Bearers were not only women, they included two men. They are Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus. What they have in common is that all of them did something very important, they cared for the body of Christ.

The men took down the body of Christ and anointed it with spices. They carefully wrapped His body and placed it in a tomb. The women seeing this came the next day to do the same thing, care for His body. The women were the ones who first heard of the resurrection. They were then tasked to bring this message to the disciples. All of this was done in the face of great danger.

As I write this message we are all about to enter into the time of the resurrection. We are about to receive this message that Christ is Risen from the dead. The Myrrh Bearers remind us of what we must do, which is to care for the body of Christ thus continuing the joyful message that Christ is Risen. We do this by caring for one another and this beautiful Cathedral. Remember, all of us make up the body of Christ. Who are Myrrh Bearers? Those who sing are Myrrh Bearers, those who clean are Myrrh Bearers, those who garden and take care of the grounds are Myrrh Bearers, those who bake are Myrrh Bearers, those who donate are Myrrh Bearers, those who work at the festivals are Myrrh Bearers, those who care for the sick are Myrrh Bearers, and those who pray are Myrrh Bearers.

I pray that we remember to be Myrrh Bearers and announce the resurrection of Christ. I hope we remember that the best way to do this is to care for one another, the body of Christ. In so doing we will continue to proclaim Christ is Risen in word and deed.

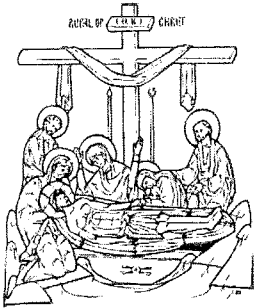

We will continue to offer our young ladies the opportunity to be Myrrh bearers on Holy Friday. The service begins at 7:30 pm. If you are interested in having your daughter

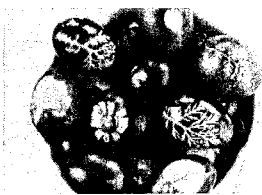
participate please let Maria Tzankis or Pres. Jenny know. Practice will be after the Holy Friday retreat. This is open to all of our HOPE and JOY girls.

Holy Week and Easter

Dear Parish family and friends,

As we approach Great and Holy week there are many opportunities for you to participate in the services and offer of yourself as well. In the next few weeks you will receive our annual Easter packet with more detailed information and detailed information about the schedule for the Holy Week. We would like to offer you the opportunity to help with decorating the Epitaphios. We ask that you arrive at 10 am for the decorating. Kelly Yakumithis will coordinate our parish volunteers. If you have any questions please see Kelly.

Holy Week: An Explanation

Great Lent and Holy Week are two separate fasts, and two separate celebrations. Great Lent ends on Friday of the fifth week (the day before Lazarus Saturday). Holy Week begins immediately thereafter. Let's explore the meaning of each of the solemn days of Passion Week.

Lazarus Saturday: Lazarus Saturday is the day which begins Holy Week. It commemorates the raising of our Lord's friend Lazarus, who had been in the tomb four days. This act confirmed the universal resurrection from the dead that all of us will experience at our Lord's Second Coming. This miracle led many to faith, but it also led to the chief priest's and Pharisees' decision to kill Jesus (John 11:47-57).

Palm Sunday (The Entrance of our Lord into Jerusalem): Our Lord enters Jerusalem and is proclaimed king - but in an earthly sense, as many people of His time were seeking a political Messiah. Our Lord is King, of course, but of a different type - the eternal King prophesied by Zechariah the Prophet. We use palms on this day to show that we too accept Jesus as the true King and Messiah of the Jews, Who we are willing to follow - even to the cross.

Holy Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday: The first thing that must be said about these services, and most of the other services of Holy Week, is that they are "sung" in anticipation. Each service is rotated ahead twelve hours. The evening service, therefore, is actually the service of the next morning, while the morning services of Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday are actually the services of the coming evening.

Understanding that, let's turn to the Services of Holy Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday (celebrated Palm Sunday, Monday and Tuesday evening). The services of these days are known as the Bridegroom or Nymphios Orthros Services. At the first service of Palm Sunday evening, the priest carries the icon of Christ the Bridegroom in procession, and we sing the "Hymn of the Bridegroom." We behold Christ as the Bridegroom of the Church, bearing the marks of His suffering, yet preparing a marriage Feast for us in God's Kingdom.

Each of these Bridegroom Orthros services has a particular theme. On Holy Monday, the Blessed Joseph, the son of Jacob the Patriarch, is commemorated. Joseph is often seen as a Type of Christ. Joseph was betrayed by his brothers, thrown into a pit, and sold into slavery by them. In the same way, our Lord was rejected, betrayed by His own, and sold into the slavery of death. The Gospel reading for the day is about the barren fig tree, which Christ cursed and withered because it bore no fruit. The fig tree is a parable of those who have heard God's word, but who fail to bear the fruit of obedience. Originally the withering of the fig tree was a testimony against those Jews who rejected God's word and His Messiah. However, it is also a warning to all people, in all times, of the importance of not only hearing the God's word, but putting it into action. The Parable of the Ten Virgins is read on Holy Tuesday. It tells the story of the five virgins who filled their lamps in preparation for receiving the bridegroom while the other five allowed their lamps to go out, and hence were shut out of the marriage feast. This parable is a warning that we must always be prepared to receive our Lord when He comes again. The theme of the day is reinforced by the exhortation hymn we sing: "I see Thy Bridal Chamber adorned, O my Savior, but have no wedding garment that I may enter. O Giver of Light, enlighten the vesture of my soul, and save me." The theme of Holy Wednesday is repentance and forgiveness. We remember the sinful woman who anointed our Lord in anticipation of His death. Her repentance and love of Christ is the theme of the wonderful "Hymn of Kassiane" which is chanted on this night, reminding us one more

time, before "it is too late," that we too may be forgiven if we repent.

Holy Unction: The Mystery or Sacrament of Holy Unction is celebrated on Holy Wednesday evening. Actually this service can be celebrated any time during the year, especially when one is ill. However, because of our need for forgiveness and spiritual healing, we offer this service during Holy Week for the remission of our sins. We should prepare for this service in a prayerful way, as we do for Holy Communion.

Great and Holy Thursday: On Holy Thursday we turn to the last events of our Lord and His Passion. Thursday morning begins with a Vespers Divine Liturgy commemorating the Mystical Supper. As previously mentioned, this is actually Holy Thursday evening's service celebrated in the morning in anticipation. Everyone who is able should make an effort to receive Holy Communion at this service as it was at the Mystical Supper that our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist. At this Liturgy a second Host is consecrated and kept in the Tabernacle. It is from this Host that Holy Communion is distributed to the shut-ins and the sick throughout the coming year.

Thursday evening actually begins the services of Great and Holy Friday. The service of the Twelve Passion Gospels commemorates the solemn time of our Lord's Crucifixion. After the reading of the fifth Gospel, the holy cross is carried around the church in procession, and Christ's body is nailed to the cross in the center of the church.

Great and Holy Friday: This is a day of strict fast. As little as possible should be eaten on this day. It is the only day in the entire year that no Divine Liturgy of any kind can be celebrated. In the morning we celebrate the Royal Hours. These solemn hours are observed as we read the various accounts and hymns concerning the crucifixion. In the afternoon we celebrate the Vesper service of the taking down of Christ's body from the cross. During the Gospel reading, our Lord's body is taken off the cross and wrapped in a new, white linen sheet. This act commemorates the removal of Christ's body from the cross by Joseph of Arimathea (John 19:38-42). Later in the service, the Epitaphios, or winding-sheet, with Christ's body on it is carried in procession and placed in the recently decorated tomb. In the evening the Lamentations Orthros service is sung. This service begins in a solemn manner, but by the end of the service we are already anticipating the Resurrection of our Lord. Remember again, that the Holy Friday evening Orthros is actually the first service of Holy Saturday, the day in which we commemorate our Lord's body resting in the tomb while His all-pure soul descends into Hades to free the faithful of the Old Covenant.

Great and Holy Saturday: This day is a day of hope and waiting. In the morning we celebrate a Vespers Divine Liturgy which commemorates Christ's victory over death. Bright vestments are worn as we anticipate Christ's Resurrection. Laurel leaves are strewn throughout the church during the service, because in the ancient world laurel leaves were a sign of victory. As the leaves are strewn, the choir chants "Arise O God and Judge the earth, for to Thee belong all the nations." The Old Testament story of Jonah in the belly of the whale is read at this service because Jonah is seen in the Church as a Type of Christ. As Jonah was three days in the belly of the great fish, and was then safely deposited back onto land, so our Lord was three days in the tomb before His glorious Resurrection. The Vespers Divine Liturgy of Holy Saturday concludes the services of Holy Week, and brings us to the eve of Great and Holy Pascha.

PROSFORA BAKERS NEEDED

St. Paul writes, "The Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'this is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me'" (I Cor. 11:24).

The altar bread represents Jesus who is the Bread of Life. Through Father Larry's sermons we have been reminded that the making of Prosfora is giving a great gift of ourselves and love to God. Bread not only represents Jesus, but it also expresses the offering of our life to God.

We are in need of Prosfora bakers. Our ladies and gentlemen have diminished over the years. Some parishioners have moved away, some have become ill and some have passed away. The greatest part of this is everyone qualifies! Anyone young or old can make Prosfora. Only a few times per year are you asked to prepare bread for a Divine Liturgy. What better way for a family to give of themselves and their love for our Church.

"I've never made Prosfora, I don't know how, I don't have a seal" are common excuses, but are no longer acceptable. If you have never made bread or Prosfora before I am willing to demonstrate at your home, demonstrate at the church building or demonstrate in my home. Seals are for sale in the Book Store, or you can borrow one from the church or from other bakers, or from me.

Prosfora can be made in a bread machine, with a mixer that has dough hooks, or by hand. It can easily be an individual's offering or an offering made by the whole family. Children love to knead bread or be able to put the seal on and for the children it is a learning experience. Individuals have said it is very therapeutic, letting their worries fade away or working out their frustrations while kneading the dough. Finally it is a great offering of life and love to God.

Community Cookbook by Jeanne Gatoura

In anticipation of preparing for Pascha, you can depend on *Olives, Feta, Phyllo & More* for creating both the traditional and a variation on the classics helping you to introduce new flavors for the holiday.

Kypros Proestos, a well-regarded chef for Holy Trinity's Mageritsa, shared an Easter Soup recipe which uses a lamb heart and beef tongue. To begin making this deliciously satisfying soup for breaking the Lenten Fast, first the heart and tongue are boiled in salted water and cooked for 90 minutes to 2 hours. The broth is strained and reserved and the meat is chopped. In a Dutch oven, scallions, celery, fresh dill and parsley are fried with butter for about ten minutes. Once the broth and meat are added, the soup is brought to a boil, then over medium heat cooks for an hour. Then rice is added and should continue to cook for about another 45 minutes until both

the rice and meat are tender, then removed from heat, and finished with an avgolemono. This Mageritsa recipe makes 10 to 12 servings.

For a divine twist on traditional baklava, try Mary Ann Griffin's Hazelnut Cranberry Baklava with Pear Filling. To create this elegant pastry, begin by whipping softened cream cheese with peeled and cubed Anjou pears until smooth and then blend in honey, eggs, and lemon peel. In a separate bowl, hazelnuts, dried cranberries, sugar, ground cinnamon and cloves are combined for the spice mixture. Ten individually buttered phyllo sheets are layered in the bottom of a buttered pan onto which one half of the cream cheese blend is spread, then sprinkled with a portion of the spice mixture. After another layer of phyllo, cream cheese blend, and spice mixture is done, the baklava is finished with phyllo and the remaining spice mixture on top. The baklava is baked for 45 to 60 minutes until golden brown and the center is set, then cooled and refrigerated.

1. **Organization presidents or leaders.** If you are an organization president or leader, please have a brief narrative written of your organization's activities during the last 25 years (1990 – 2015). Identify who the presidents of your organization were, the dates of the activities and what your organization accomplished. Focus on the significant events of your organization's activities. Locate pictures of events. Date the event and identify the people in the pictures. We will include a picture of your entire membership.

2. **Parishioners.** This will be a rare opportunity to share your family's history with the parish for posterity. Please write your favorite memory of Holy Trinity, your involvement with the parish, or a special person or family member. If you're writing about a person other than yourself, identify who that person is with a first and last name and the dates about which you're writing. Do not write "Yiayia Stachtapoutha and Papou Kakomati came here a long time ago." Please be specific. Identify who you are and your relationship to that person. Your story should answer the questions "who, what, when and where." If your family came to Toledo from another place, explain why you, or they, came to Toledo and to Holy Trinity.

Our parish has several large family clans. If you're a member of one of these family clans, you may want to divide the task of writing with your family members, such as your uncles and aunts, cousins, grandparents or God parents.

Please send **a copy** of your material to the parish office in printed / typed form. Include your name and contact information (phone, home address, email address). Electronic format is preferred. Any pictures you submit should be **copies** of the original. **DO NOT SEND** original family heirloom pictures. Identify the date of the picture and the people in the picture, along with your relationship to them. It should read like a story with a beginning, middle and end. If you have difficulty writing your story, put your thoughts on paper. We'll try to put it together for you. Thanks in advance for your cooperation and assistance. Chris J. God's Gifts: 2015 Stewardship Program

For those of you who were unable to attend the March 29th General Assembly Meeting, Joyce Anagnos and I, Kathy Chaka, your new Stewardship Chairpersons, would like to briefly repeat the presentation we made on *Myths About Stewardship*.

- The first myth surrounds the **privacy** of your Stewardship Commitment. Many people are under the **false impression** that because there is a Stewardship Committee, these committee members must be privy to the amount of money that parishioners pledge, **FALSE!** The only

person that sees how much people are pledging is our Treasurer and Carole Faoiz, our Cathedral Secretary. Not even Father Larry sees that information. Carole is aware of what each parishioner pledges and she does a "phenomenal" job of keeping track of it ALL, as parishioners complete their pledges throughout the year.

- The second myth surrounds these yearly **Stewardship Commitment Cards**. Each October, we ask the entire Parish to fill out a Stewardship Commitment Card indicating what we believe our Stewardship pledge will be for the year. However, many people do not fill one out for various personal reasons. **The myth is that this is a binding contract** that can not be broken and could somehow ruin your credit. It is in the very simplest of terms, a very important tool that the Treasurer can use to create a budget for the coming year. How can we mindfully and responsibly plan for expenses throughout the year, if we have no idea what our income will be? If **EVERY** Parishioner would fill out a Stewardship Commitment Card it would give us an idea of what lies ahead in the coming year. If you find that you want to **CHANGE YOUR COMMITMENT** for whatever reason, raise it or lower it, you are more than welcome to do so at **ANYTIME**, just tell Carole.

We believe it is very important to dispel these myths because as we progress toward the moment where we finally pay off our mortgage in the next few months, we will all then be asked to turn to our Stewardship numbers to see, "Where do we go from here?"

F.Y.I., in October, we began our 2015 Stewardship Campaign with a very well received Stewardship Sunday. Since that day, 125 of our 325 families have submitted a commitment card for 2015. It is the goal of this committee to continue to reach out to those families who have not returned a commitment card in the hope that we can have 100% participation in our Holy Trinity Stewardship Program.

2015 Stewardship Update through March 20th - Our Stewardship goal for 2015 is \$240,000

So far 168 Stewards have turned in a pledge cards totaling \$159,832.

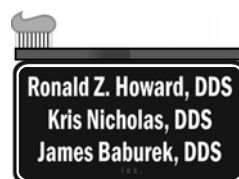

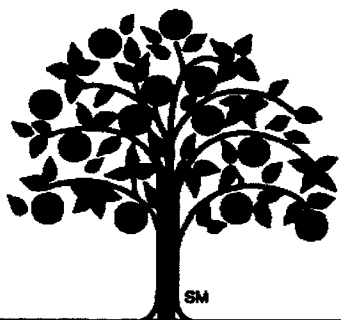
