

HOLY TRINITY HISTORY FROM THE TOLEDO BLADE

POLICE GUARDING GREEK PASTOR

From the Toledo Blade Newspaper - November 8, 1923.

"The Rev A. Mandelaria, new pastor of the Greek Orthodox church, Superior and Walnut streets, was under police guard in the church sanctuary, Thursday morning prior to scheduled services at 9:30 with which a faction that opposed his election threatened to interfere. Detectives Carroll and Timiney were sent to the church at the new pastor's request.

The Rev. Mandelaria was elected pastor, Wednesday in a close election, succeeding the Rev Emmanuel Papastafanou, who was favored by a faction nearly as large as that which elevated the Rev Mandelaria to the position.

Police were told that the Minority faction had made threats against the other.

Despite the threats the Rev. Mandelaria announced that services would be held as scheduled.

A few of the opposing faction were on hand at the appointed time."

As the outdoor temperatures continue to rise over the next couple of months, nothing satisfies like a cool and refreshing dessert. So chill out with Antonia Sares Irmen's Ice Cream Country Pie, a favorite at their smaller family gatherings. To begin preparing this richly flavored recipe which was adapted from her aunt, Luanna Sares, a half-gallon of ice cream is set out to soften. In a bowl, a cereal mixture is created by first combining brown sugar and melted butter to which corn flakes are stirred in. To this, chopped nuts and if desired, coconut are thoroughly mixed in. Two thirds of the cereal mixture is used to line a 9 inch pie plate over which the softened ice cream is spread and then topped with either fudge or butterscotch topping and the remaining cereal mixture. The pie should be frozen until ready to serve. Antonia added that this recipe creates 8 to 10 servings and a small piece goes a long way.






