Dear Parish Family and Friends,
Not too long ago I lost my wedding ring. It was, as one would understand, very upsetting. The kids and I looked and looked and could not find it. The next day I went out and looked again and again I could not find it. A friend came over with a metal detector and again we could not find it. Eventual another friend came with a metal detector and we finally found it! I was so happy to find it and relieved. On a spiritual level humanity has lost something as well. What did we lose? We lost a strong unity and relationship with God. We may have lost other relationships during the year as well. This is why our Savior was sent to us to help regain what was lost. On March $15^{\text {th }}$ we begin another Lenten Journey. We begin another journey to strengthen our relationship with Christ and one another.

Great Lent is our time to work on rebuilding or strengthening our relationships. First, with God. We do this by setting aside time for Him. We are asked to focus more on that relationship by being present in Church more, by absenting from certain foods more, and by reaching out to those who are need more. As we focus on God then other relationships heal and grow stronger as well. Saint Dorotheos of Gaza tells us how this happens:
> "Imagine a circle with its center and radii or rays going out from this center. The further these radii are from the center the more widely they are dispersed and separated from one another; and conversely, the closer they come to the center, the closer they are to one another.
> Suppose now that this circle is the world, the very center of the circle is God, and the lines going from the center to the circumference or from the circumference to the center are the paths of men's lives. Then here we see the same.
> Insofar as the Saints move inward within the circle towards its center, wishing to come near to God, then, in the degree of their penetration, they come closer both to God and to one another; moreover, inasmuch as they come nearer to God, they come nearer to one another, and inasmuch as they come nearer to one another, they come nearer to God. It is the same with drawing away ....
> Such is the property of love; inasmuch as we are outside and do not love God, so each is far from his neighbor. But if we love God, inasmuch as we come near to Him by love of Him, so we become united by love with our neighbors, and inasmuch as we become united by love with our neighbors, so we become united with God." (Saint Dorotheos of Gaza, Directions on Spiritual Training, 4)

My parish family and friends I pray that we remember to take this opportunity to grow closer to our Lord. To regain the relationship with Him that may have been lost and weakened over the year. I pray we remember that as we approach God with a humble and open heart we not only gain unity with Him but with all those around us. A Blessed Lent!

## The President's Message by Denny Lawrence

I am honored to have been selected as Parish Council President this year and look forward as we gather together in God's name, to enjoy each other's company, to share our values and ideas and to celebrate the simple things in life.

In 2015 we completed an eight year journey to pay off the Community Center mortgage. Many outside our community were amazed we were able to complete this task in time for our $100^{\text {th }}$ anniversary celebration. Once again, we have shown when our community works together, we can accomplish important goals that make a difference.

We also hosted a memorable $100^{\text {th }}$ Anniversary celebration in our Community Center. This was a spectacular event and the culmination of a year-long series of activities to celebrate our first 100 years. Concurrent with our anniversary celebration, we also experienced a 100-year torrential storm with six inches of rain in twelve hours and continuous 40 to 50 mile per hour winds. This storm identified repairs that we need to make to our Community Center and Cathedral.

First, we must repair leaks in the community center roof over the kitchen and storage area. The roof repair was approved by Parish Assembly last fall and Parish Council has selected a contractor. We expect to sign the roof repair contract and complete repairs to the Community Center roof before our festival this fall.

Next, we need to identify what repairs are needed to stop water leaks in our Cathedral dome, the south bell tower and north wall. Parish Council representatives have met with several contractors to determine the cause of the leaks. We believe repairs to the Cathedral will need to take place over several years. Our goal this year is to develop a repair plan and its associated cost for Parish Assembly review this fall.

Now that we have retired our Community Center mortgage, we need to refocus our efforts on stewardship. Stewardship is among the most important spiritual responsibilities of each Orthodox Christian. It enables the church - the Body of Christ - to fulfill its mission. We ask you to make a commitment to support our Parish and its ministries. Your commitment card provides confirmation on your part to support the needs of our parish. If you have not done so, please complete a commitment card and return it to the parish office as soon as possible. The Stewardship Committee's article in
this month's Echo contains important information. Please read it carefully.

Last year's accomplishments were truly remarkable and I thank you for allowing me to take part in these events. I look forward to the challenges we face this year and believe our community, when it works together, can accomplish important goals that make a difference in our parish.

## Stewardship by Co-Chairs Kathy Chaka and Joyce Anagnos

## Those that seek the Lord shall never 6e in want of any good thing!"

As the cold winds of March blow in, it is difficult to imagine that spring will be right around the corner. It is amazing how quickly time has passed since we all gathered together at the Vasilopita to ring in the New Year. As members of the Stewardship Committee, we too find ourselves analyzing the passage of time. In order to be transparent, it is important that everyone in our community knows how we finished with Stewardship for 2015, so that we can understand the work that needs to be done for 2016.

In 2015, 301 people/families participated in the Stewardship Program. Of those, 257 filled out commitment cards and 44 participated, but did not fill out commitment cards. Our goal for 2015 was $\$ 240,000$ and our Stewardship Program brought in $\$ 221,561$. It is our hope that those who have not yet fulfilled their 2015 Stewardship Commitment are still planning to do so. Though we fell short of our goal, we are optimistic that our message is being heard. In a year where we were trying to pay off our mortgage, and parishioners were digging deep to make additional financial commitments to the church in order to make that happen, we still had the highest participation in the Stewardship Commitment Card program ever!

Obviously, the bottom line is that with each year as our expenses continue to grow, our Stewardship cannot continue to operate at a deficit. Our new goal for 2016 is $\$ 250,000$ and we are very pleased to report an overwhelming response by parishioners turning in their 2016 Stewardship Commitment Cards. To date, with a history of approximately 300 families traditionally participating in the Stewardship Program, we currently
have over half of our families already submitting their 2016 Commitment Cards. But there is still work to do. We know that there are many people/families in our Holy Trinity community that we would love to have become Stewards of our Church, and it is our hope to have $100 \%$ participation in the Stewardship Program!

Holy Trinity is not only our Church, but our spiritual home. Let us all guard her and take care of her for generations to come.

## Community Cookbook by Jeanne Gatoura

A search through Olives, Feta, Phyllo \& More! will reveal a myriad of flavorful salads and vegetable dishes that will both satisfy the appetite and meet fasting guidelines, helping to make your Lenten journey a pleasant one.

This delicious Lenten recipe for Potato Salad, which appeared in The Blade with Demetra Theodorou featured preparing it, is enjoyable on its own or as an accompaniment. To begin, potatoes are boiled until tender - Demetra cautioned that it's important not to overcook potatoes for a good salad result. Peeled and sliced potatoes are then combined with onions, salt, olive oil and oregano and tossed to mix. The final step, to garnish with sliced tomatoes on the top, creates a beautiful presentation.

A steamy dish of Cabbage \& Rice is ideal for the Lenten season. To prepare this recipe from Ursula Xanthakos, onion and garlic are sautéed in olive oil. Thinly sliced cabbage, chopped celery, green pepper, fresh tomato or diced canned tomatoes, and tomato paste are added and stirred well. Next Ursula adds water, then sprinkles Uncle Ben's rice on top and cooks for ten minutes until the rice is tender. The whole mixture is stirred together and on low heat, simmers for another 10 minutes.

Tabbouleh is a delicious and filling salad to have on hand during Lent. For her recipe, Dorothy Yakumithis begins by covering either medium or fine grain bulgar wheat in a bowl with water. While soaking for ten minutes, chopped parsley, mint, and onion are combined in a separate bowl. Then the water is drained and squeezed from the wheat and added to the parsley mixture. Lemon juice, oil, salt and pepper are mixed in well. The entire preparation should be covered tightly and refrigerated overnight. Before serving, peeled and chopped tomatoes and cucumbers are added and also mixed in well. Dorothy makes Tabbouleh quite often during the year and sends it home with her children when they visit. On behalf of the Cookbook Committee, I hope Olives, Feta, Phyllo \& More! is a convenient source for all your culinary needs throughout the Lenten season.
