

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

When Nicholas was much younger he had great difficulty with change. Any time we were going to start a new game or transition to something different he would have a fit. We would have to prepare him by talking to him, in advance, so he was prepared for the change. I think many of us can relate to this. Change can most certainly be a difficult process. This process can be made even more difficult when this "change" is unexpected. Although change can be difficult it is very much part of our faith. Our faith is not only about change but our Lord teaches how to go through change as well.

In the middle of our Lenten journey the Church offers us the Cross of our Lord to gaze upon. The Cross reminds us of many things. It reminds us of God's love, Christ's victory over sin, evil, and death. It reminds us of the positive changes that can happen to us through Christ's death on the Cross and resurrection from the dead. It reminds us to follow and draw strength from Christ who wants us to come to Him. This notion of change is not foreign to our beloved Cathedral. Three months ago our parish changed dramatically with the loss of our beloved Father Chris. For many of you this might be the first time you are going through Lent, Holy Week, and Easter without him. This will be the first time in a long time that we do not hear Father's familiar cadence as he reads the paschal homily of St. John Chrysostom. Our parish is in a time of change. The changes that are happening can bring about feelings of sadness and anxiety. This is why it is even more important for us, this year, to look upon the Cross of Christ. This Cross will give us strength. It will give us strength because it reminds us of our Lord's great love for us. He willingly ascended upon that Cross for us. When he did, He gave us the potential to grow closer to him and to change, in a positive way.

My friends and family, the cross is a lesson for us. A lesson of how we will get through our first Lent without Father Chris. A lesson as to how we will deal with all the changes that come up. This lesson is one of Love. St. John the Evangelist in his first letter writes, "My little children, let us not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth." The Cross is a sign of God's love for us in deed and truth. All of us are called to do the same, to love God and one another with all the gifts, talents, and faults that we may have. This is the true measure of what it means to be a Church. May our Lord bless you through Lent and grant you a glorious Pascha.

Now that the weather is improving, we are moving forward in our efforts to identify what repairs are needed to stop water leaks in our Cathedral dome, the south bell tower and north wall. We believe repairs to the Cathedral will need to take place over several years. Our goal this year is to develop a repair plan and its associated cost for Parish Assembly review this fall.

Now that we have retired our Community Center mortgage, we need to refocus our efforts on stewardship. Christian Stewardship Is... "...learning how to be a responsible and concerned caretaker of Christ's Church; it is learning how to enjoy Church life and be happy in Church work for in Her dwells the fullness of the Spirit of God."

Community Cookbook by Jeanne Gatoura

The Cookbook Committee is thrilled to announce that Sophie Stathopoulos is our newest member. Sophie served as a Committee Chair during the Cookbook's development and has been an active participant in the Greek Cooking Series since its inception. We know her extensive experience with *Olive, Feta, Phyllo & More!* combined with her business acumen will be valuable assets as we continue our mission to share Holy Trinity's rich culinary history throughout the Toledo area and beyond.

In anticipation of Pascha, you can depend on the Cookbook for creating both traditional recipes as well as a variation on the classics providing fresh ideas for your holiday dinner. For instance, a Roasted Red Pepper & Feta Dip from Maria Limbert Markakis would provide a compatible prelude to the meal. To prepare this tasty recipe, a jarred whole roasted red pepper, crumbled feta cheese, a small garlic clove and olive oil are placed in a food processor and pulsed for ten seconds. Once the sides are scraped down, pulsing is repeated until all ingredients are well combined, about one minute. The dip is placed in a bowl and refrigerated until ready to serve. Maria added that it's great served with carrot sticks, celery sticks, toasted pita chips, or tortilla chips.

For a divine twist on traditional baklava, Irene Kaufman's Pineapple Cheese Baklava would be a wonderful addition to your pastry selections. To begin creating the filling's rich flavor, ricotta cheese, softened cream cheese, sugar, egg yolks, lemon zest and vanilla are blended in either a mixer or a food processor. Drained canned crushed pineapple is stirred in, then, the entire combination is poured over five layered and buttered phyllo sheets in an 11x17 inch pan. Over the filling another five phyllo sheets are added, buttered individually, the top is then scored into diamond shapes and baked for 50 minutes in a preheated 350 degree oven till golden. The syrup is prepared by combining the reserved pineapple juice which has been strained, sugar, and lemon juice and cooking to a syrup consistency, then cooled. Irene stressed that cool syrup should be ladled onto a hot baklava. Once the baklava is cool, the pieces are cut all the way through.

"Those that seek the Lord shall never be in want of any good thing"


For all of us, the Lenten season is a time of reflection. A time to consider the many blessings that God has bestowed upon us. One of the greatest blessings for all of us is being a member of Holy Trinity and having the privilege of calling this Cathedral our home. There is a lot of good work going on here at Holy Trinity and it is clearly evident in all our ministries. We all devote so much time here, doing so many good things, for so many people, and that is truly the work that God asks of us during Lent and throughout our lives.

The Stewardship Committee has also been spending a lot of time lately reflecting. With this reflection, we've come to the realization that Stewardship is a blessing and at the same time a challenge, and it's a challenge that we have been working on for years. Many people in this community, past and present, have worked on Stewardship committees spending their time and energy trying to think of ways to spread "the message". The message being that our Stewardship commitment is the BEST way that we can ensure the stability of this Church for generations to come. We are so thankful that many people have heard this message, and have understood it, and have acted upon it by filling out their Stewardship Commitment Cards.

However, the data suggests that we have a long way to go... Looking at data dating back to 2007 we can see that the total number of Stewards (Family Units Giving) was 352 families. That number has consistently dropped over the last nine years. Our present number at the end of 2015 is 301 Stewards. The data might seem to suggest that we are losing families here at Holy Trinity, however our Church directory boasts up to 500 possible Stewards. We need to encourage these families/individuals to consider becoming Stewards of Holy Trinity and we need everyone's help in this endeavor.

Being a Steward of Holy Trinity is and should always be, a badge of honor, that individuals and families in our community wear that says, "I am working to help keep Holy Trinity alive and thriving for my children and my children's children." Being a member of Holy Trinity, in a sense, makes us ALL a member of the Stewardship Committee, because through our Stewardship Commitment, we are making a pledge to spread the message and work towards sustaining the future of this great Cathedral. 




