Dear Parish Family and Friends,

Christ is Risen!

As I write this letter to you we are preparing ourselves to receive Christ on the Glorious day of His Resurrection. We are preparing ourselves to receive the "Fos", the light of Christ, and then pass it to each other. As I thought about Pascha and receiving the light, I was reminded of the importance of light in our lives. As a father of three kids, who rarely pick up after themselves, I can tell you that walking around at night without light can be dangerous! At times it feels like I am walking through a minefield. The same is true when it comes to our faith. Walking around in this world without the light of Christ can be dangerous as well. Without Him the chances of stumbling and falling are much greater.

One of the most beautiful sights on the night of the Resurrection is seeing each of us pass the light to the other. As we do that, a once dark church becomes aglow with the light of Christ. I truly believe this is what we are called to do for each other. Having received that light, who is Christ, we are called to offer Him to others. We can do this either by word through inviting friends and family who have been gone for a while to come back home, or by deed, through our action of allowing Christ's light to shine through us. No matter how we share Christ with others, it is our responsibility not to leave that light in Church but to take it with us. We are to take it with us allowing it to enlighten our steps and the steps of others.

As we continue our journey together to our Lord's Glorious Ascension and the great day of Pentecost I pray that we hold on to the joy of Pascha. I pray that we keep a tight hold of the light of Christ that we have received. I pray that we do this so that as individual Christians and as a Church family our steps will continue to be illumined so as we walk together we continue to grow in the knowledge of our Lord.

President's Message by Denny Lawrence

The period of the Great Lent is behind us. We have commemorated the triumphant entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem and celebrated His resurrection. Now is the time to look forward to what lies ahead...

Community Center: The Community Center roof repair over the kitchen and storage area was completed during April. A full accounting of the repair costs will be published after the final invoice is received from Manchester Roofing.

Cathedral Dome Repair: Progress continues in our efforts to identify what repairs are needed to stop water leaks in our Cathedral dome, the south bell tower and north wall. A Request for Proposal has been drafted and is under review. In late April/early May we anticipate a pre-bid conference with several contractors who will physically inspect the dome and associated structures to determine what work is needed to stop the leaks in our Cathedral. Following those inspections, we plan to finalize our Request for Proposals and solicit repair estimates from interested contractors. At this point, we believe repairs to the Cathedral will need to take place over several years. Our goal this year is to develop a repair plan and its associated cost for Parish Assembly review this fall.

The Summer Lunch Program: The Summer Lunch Program will continue this year. Tony Capranica and I, along with assistance from Connie Mynihan, will organize all four events this summer. The schedule remains the same as last year – the second Thursday of May, June, July and August. There is a place at the Summer Luncheon program for any parishioner who wishes to volunteer their time and talent. Please contact Connie Mynihan or myself if you are available to work.

The Community Picnic: Planning for the Community Picnic has begun. The picnic is scheduled to take place on Friday, June 17 at Wildwood Park. Last year's event was spectacular and we expect another eventful, funfilled evening. More details will be made available soon.

Community Cookbook by Jeanne Gatoura

The Cookbook Committee expresses many thanks to Philoptochos at Holy Trinity-St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church in Cincinnati who purchased 40 Cookbooks to sell at their Greek Festival this Summer. We're also grateful to Tina Bertok, Kathy Lawrence's sister, who after her recent Toledo visit was kind enough to take the Cookbooks back to Cincinnati where she lives. With this significant dent in the remaining inventory, this also means that the 4th printing of *Olives, Feta, Phyllo & More!* will likely begin soon.

May is the month of endless excuses for a party including holidays, observances, and graduations. Whether you're hosting an event or attending a potluck and want to create something different, use the Cookbook to expand your cooking ideas with popular food from different cultures.

Bursting with genuine Mexican flavors, Stevie's Chicken Enchiladas, a recipe from Susie Doukides is a splendid dish for any occasion. To begin making the sauce, vegetable oil, chopped onions, minced garlic, seeded jalapeño and chili powder are cooked in a saucepan until the onions are translucent. Canned whole tomatoes and water are added, brought to a boil, then simmered for about 20 minutes, crushing the tomatoes slightly. To this, lime juice, salt and pepper are added. Susie fills each enchilada individually by first microwaving a flour tortilla for a few seconds, then rolling it tightly with refried beans, chopped cooked chicken, shredded Monterey Jack or Mexican blend cheese, and a pinch of pickled jalapeño, then placing it seam down in a baking dish. Once all are arranged, cover evenly with the sauce and more cheese and bake for about 5 to 10 minutes until all cheese is melted, then complete under the broiler for an additional 2 minutes. The enchiladas are topped with fresh cilantro and served with sour cream, guacamole and salsa.

Asian inspired food is sure to delight partygoers and a Chinese Cabbage Salad from Deborah Ioannidis is a delicious example. First, Napa cabbage is finely shredded. Then in a dry skillet, chicken flavored Ramen noodles, sesame seeds and slivered almonds are browned and allowed to cool. Salad dressing ingredients - oil, beef broth, sugar, soy sauce, cider vinegar - are mixed in a small bowl. Just before serving, Deborah combines the cabbage and noodle mixture in a large serving bowl, pours on the salad dressing, and makes sure to mix well so all ingredients are coated.

STEWARDSHIP 2016 by Kathy Chaka & Joyce Anagnos

"Those that seek the Lord shall never be in want of any good thing!"

For those of you who were unable to attend the April General Assembly, the following is an excerpt from the Stewardship Report that was presented...

"If every person understood that we are ALL in essence members of the Stewardship Committee by virtue of being a member of Holy Trinity, we would ALL be working hard to make sure that EVERYONE makes a financial commitment in some way to their ability, to the Church. This is the real solution to the future stability of Holy Trinity."

Stewardship is a blessing and a challenge, a challenge that many people in this community have been working on for many years. Everyone in our community agrees that a strong Stewardship program is the BEST way to

solve the financial needs of this church, but how we get that message out to our parishioners and get everyone to support it is the real challenge. Looking at trend data dating back to 2007 we can see that the total number of stewards, or Family Units Giving, was 352 families. That number has consistently dropped over the last nine years to 301 stewards. We all may be inclined to think that the trend suggests that families are leaving the Church; however, our 2016 Church directory boasts over 500 families. Currently, as of the end of March, 177 stewards have filled out Stewardship Commitment Cards. Think about it...over 500 possible families and so far, only 177 stewardship commitments. What is causing this trend? How do we reach out to everyone so that they understand that their support is vital to the future of this Parish? These are the questions your Stewardship Committee asks itself at each meeting.

To that end, we have drafted and are sending out a series of letters to all 500 possible stewards asking for everyone in our community to give. Though we acknowledge and recognize that everyone's financial situation is different for a multitude of reasons, we are pushing forward for the sake of our Church, and keeping the message in these letters simple:

- 1. If you have never filled out a Stewardship Card, please consider doing so.
- 2. If you have filled out a card in past years, but for whatever reason haven't filled one out recently, please consider doing so.
- 3. If you turned in a stewardship card at the same pledge as last year thank you so much and please reconsider that amount, and possibly raise it this year.

And 4... if you've filled out a card and raised your amount from the previous year, thank you and please consider helping us spread the word.

We will leave everyone today with this one thought. Most people would agree that being a salesman is one of the hardest jobs. If you talk to anyone who is in sales, they say that asking people for money is difficult at best. But the best salesmen, the most successful ones, are the people who truly believe in their product 100 %. We all believe in Holy Trinity 100% and we know this because our Cathedral has been around for over 100 years. So, our stewardship message to you today is to help us. Help us spread the word about all the good things that happen here, bring people into our warm, loving community and help us turn 177 Stewards into 500! Thank you and God bless.

2016 Stewardship Update through April 20th - Our Stewardship goal for 2016 is \$240,000 So far 195 Stewards have turned in a pledge cards totaling \$175,702 Stewardship contributions are \$62,526.




