Easter Morning: After the midnight resurrection service, it is customary to break the Lenten fast with the traditional Mageritsa. Once again, this traditional Easter soup was offered and prepared by Kyp Proestos family and friends. Wine was provided by the Emmanuel T. Yakumithis family and the Daughters of Penelope donated 15 loaves of Tsoureki. We enjoyed the fellowship generated by this occasion and thank all those who were able to help make this a successful community event.

Community Center Repair: The Community Center roof repair project over the kitchen and storage area is complete. Capital Improvement Funds were used to pay repair costs of \$40,961. This amount included two change orders we issued to add insulation and install a saddle to ensure proper water drainage and the cost to disconnect and reconnect the roof top walk-in cooler and freezer. Our next major Community Center project is to repair or replace the water damage to the kitchen ceiling. More on this as we investigate repair options and cost.

Planned Giving: Peter Athanas, who recently passed away, named Holy Trinity in his will. The lawyer handling Peter's estate estimates Holy Trinity will receive between \$600,000 and \$650,000 from Peter's estate in two installments. The first installment of \$325,000 has been received and was deposited in the Endowment Fund account. We expect the second installment late this year. This generous gift from Peter will be used to begin repairs to our Cathedral Dome. May his memory be eternal...

Summer Lunch Program: The Summer Lunch program got off to a good start May 12, 2016. Twenty-eight parishioners prepared and served 277 meals to our downtown community, family and friends of Holy Trinity. Net income was \$2,269. All leftover meals were donated to the needy of downtown Toledo. We thank all those who were able to help make this such a successful community event.

<u>Community Picnic</u>: The community picnic is schedule to take place on Friday, June 17 at Wildwood Park. Last year's event was spectacular and we expect another eventful, fun-filled evening. Come enjoy the fellowship and food at this community event.

<u>Cathedral Repair:</u> Progress continues in our efforts to identify what repairs are needed to stop water leaks in our Cathedral. In late May we held a pre-bid conference with several contractors who physically inspected the dome and associated structures. We plan to finalize our

Request for Proposals in June and solicit repair estimates from interested contractors. Our goal this year is to begin repairs to our Cathedral.

<u>Festival Workshops</u>: Festival workshops are underway. This is an important part of our Greek American Festival. We encourage all parishioners to support these workshops and ensure the success of this important community event.

Holy Trinity Cookbook by Jeanne Gatoura

A Cooking Class Committee has been formed and plans are underway for another Make & Take Cooking Class Series in early Fall. Using the same successful class format, students will receive "hands on" instruction from our community's experts while each prepares his or her own dish or dessert to take home. Once all details are finalized for the three class series, complete information will be available soon to share with friends, neighbors, and co-workers.

As the temperatures rise over the next couple of months, the abundance of summer's fresh produce increases too. So whether you're hosting a party, attending a potluck, or fixing a family meal let the Cookbook inspire you with its wide selection of ideas to prepare the season's bounty. For instance, when both

zucchini and fresh dill are plentiful, a savory Kolokithopita speaks summer to Katherine Resch who tries to make it two or three times during the season. This summertime culinary tradition began with her mother Paraskevi Evdemon, born in Tenedos, an area well known for their pites, who made this delicious recipe during the summer months. To create, parboiled, grated zucchini is combined with sautéed onions, cooked rice, crumbled feta, cottage cheese, beaten eggs, and minced fresh dill and mixed thoroughly. In a baking pan, five phyllo sheets, each brushed with melted butter, are layered then covered evenly with the zucchini-cheese mixture. Another five phyllo sheets, also buttered individually, are layered on top of the mixture. Once the top phyllo layers are scored into squares and brushed with a beaten egg, the pite is placed in a preheated 350 degree oven for an hour until golden.

With the smoky flavor and enhanced fresh vegetable tastes created in Matina Nicholas' Grilled Eggplant Parmesan, this outdoor version of the traditional dish will become a warm weather favorite. To begin, the eggplant should be cut into lengthwise slices, lightly brushed with olive oil, and sprinkled with salt and pepper. In a bowl feta cheese, Parmesan cheese, and chopped fresh basil are combined and set aside. The eggplant slices are grilled over direct medium heat until tender and lightly browned on both sides, about eight to ten minutes. Then fresh ripe tomato slices and the cheese mixture are added, the grill is covered and the eggplants should cook until the cheese melts and tomato slices are warm, about one to two minutes.






