Dear Parish Family and Friends,

No musical (or Greek speaking) experience is necessary and we welcome new members into our musical community at any time. Since the group has been primarily chanting hymns to the Theotokos, we have begun sharing icons and stories. Here is a story about an icon of the



Theotokos called "She Who Exists" ('Η Υπάρχουσα).

In the autumn of 1995, the Mother of God appeared to a young lady in Jerusalem, who had previously been Muslim, and was directed by the Theotokos to believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and be baptized in the Orthodox Church.

The Mother of Our Savior willed as follows: I desire an icon of Myself to be made with my face sad, clothing in black, and the three fingers of the right hand joined together. The name of the icon will be "She Who

Exists" (Ἡ Υπάρχουσα). (The icon was painted in the autumn of 1996.)

In 2002, on the feast of the Entry of Our Lady Theotokos into the Temple, after the celebration of the Liturgy in the church of the monastery of St. Nicodemus, tears miraculously began to flow from the eyes of the icon. Since then, the eyes have remained full of tears. The sorrowful expression of the face, the black clothing, together with the tears, signify mankind's apostasy and forebode the coming distress, and the presence of the antichrist. The three fingers joined together signify the One Eternal and True God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The title "Hyparchousa" (The Existing One") signifies that She is truly Mother of God, the Son Our Savior, and has the prerogative of rescuing by virtue of the great grace conferred to Her. And if the heretics and those who are not baptized blaspheme Her in saying She does not exist, we will always confess, "Thou are God-Bearer, and we sinners have thee as intercessor before the Lord". ---- The Prison of St. Peter JERUSALEM. 2002.

## Hellenic Dance Company News by Persilla Zervos, Director

Rehearsals for the 2016 Greek Festival started on June 6<sup>th</sup>. The first 4 rehearsals took place during Holy Trinity's month long Summer of the Arts Program. It was a welcome sight greeting new and previous dancers that participated in the dance, art and church music program. Holy Trinity's Hellenic Dance Company's summer program is open to all children, teens and young adults.

The Hellenic Dance Company is made up of 4 dance groups. Dancers rehearsed from the beginning of June to the first week of September. Each group rehearsed anywhere from 8 hours to 30 hours to prepare their group's performance for Holy Trinity's Annual Greek Festival. It is around the end of August that Hellenic dance directors and instructors start paying attention to long-range weather forecasts. We try to avoid the "R" word. Hoping that by not saying it out loud we are able somehow to keep the dark clouds at bay. However, weather reports indicated that we would have "rain" on Friday and Saturday- the festival's biggest days. Regardless of those predictions it only rained on and off Saturday afternoon. Festival patrons carrying umbrellas kept coming and the 2016 Greek Festival was the biggest one ever!!

The **Ellinopedia** include our youngest dancers. Dance teaching methods include skipping and counting games and teaching right from left. The ability to skip is very important in Greek dancing. We also attempt as instructors to emphasize the beat of the music.

Who could resist our adorable Ellinopedia Dancers as they performed 5 dances during their Friday, Saturday and Sunday performances? Dancers included: Gus Atherine, Zoe Bollin, Jacob Calcamuggio, Demi Deason, Gus Jackson, Caede Karavas, Lukia Legakis, Francesca Lizcano, Olivia MacLaren Harringan, Nicko Marinis, Steven Owen, Billy Plomaritis, Laila Proestos, Gabriella Semaan, Alexandria Xenofontos, Andreanna Xenofontos and Mariam Xenofontos.

As you read through this article you will notice that some dancers belong to two groups. They are transition dancers. They have the ability to move to a more advanced group but leave a void in their previous group. So we ask the dancers and their parents if they can be members of two groups. This also entails performing twice each day of the festival. This way we stabilize each group. Transition dancers help the younger group by leading and staying on beat.

**Asteria Transition Helpers** included: Natalie Arvanitis, Amalia Bollin, Evie Jackson, Charlotte

Lizcano, Gus Matthews, Zachary Proestos, Nikko Theodorou and Mya Toney.

The Asteria Dancers make up the next group. One immediately notices that this group needs no assistance from the dance instructors. Rehearsals have taught them more intricate dances and choreography. Dance leaders besides knowing the routine to a dance also are aware of the group's stage presence. Leaders learn the signals that indicate a change in choreography. This group did a great job in their performances.

The Asteria Dancers performed 7 dances every day of the festival and they were: Nathan Arginis, Natalie Arvanitis (also Olympian), Eliza Atherine (also Olympian), Amalia Bollin, Bella Calcamuggio, Evvie Jackson (also Olympian), Gus Jackson (also Ellinopedia), Vasilia Legakis, Charlotte Lizcano, Veronica Lizcano (also Olympian), Karris Marinis, Bella Matthews (also Olympian), Gus Matthews, Conner Nicodemus (also Olympian), Zachary Proestos, Nikko Theodorou and Mya Toney

The **Olympians Dancers** make up the third group and this is where instruction is not only about learning the steps to a dance. We spend time encouraging dancers to understand what is involved in leading their group. These lessons continue to the advanced level of the Hellenic Dancers. All the dancers in the group have to know each dance routine but a dance leader:

- must know the routine perfectly
- must be able to teach the routine to others
- must be able to make calls for a change in choreography (at the Hellenic Dancer level very few dances have the leader doing his own thing while the rest of the line does the same step over and over)
- must be aware of stage presence- where is the line on the dance floor, and
- and must be prepared for the transition to the dance and to the next dance in the performance.

Our **Olympian Dancers** traditionally put on a perfect show. We don't know what it is about this group. Their Monday night rehearsals are chaotic but once they dress in costume and prepare to start their festival performance an amazing change takes place. We are not sure if it is nerves or perhaps self-confidence?

This was the only group that could not complete a performance. The Saturday Olympian performance started well but a very light rain began to fall. I signaled the dancers not to be surprised when we cut the rest of the dances short in order to finish their performance. However, the clouds parted and there was a downpour. They were very disappointed but danced a flawless performance on Sunday.

The Olympian Dance Group performed 8 dances and included: Natalie Arvanitis, Eliza Atherine, Jackson Bollin, Iliana Calcamuggio, Scott Deason, Evvie Jackson, Nicholas Legakis, Veronica Lizcano, Bella Matthews, Theodora Mitsopoulos, Conner Nicodemus, Marianna Temple and Blake Theodorou.

Hellenic Dancer Helpers were: Nicole Arvanitis, Lauren Dionyssiou and Nicki Owen.

The height of the Hellenic Dancers program is to perform at Holy Trinity's Greek Festival. No other gig carries as heavily on the shoulders of the senior group. The Hellenic Dancers have been recognized by many that have had the opportunity to see other Greek dance groups perform. Among those are His Eminence, Metropolitan Nicholas, the Levendes Band, the Enigma Band, Greek Dance Director from other mid-west churches - they all agree Holy Trinity's Hellenic Dancers put on a spectacular show!. It is a joint effort to continue in this tradition. However, since the 2014 dance season we have seen a decrease in Hellenic dancers. Previous dancers moved away, got married or couldn't make it back from college. This has left a very young group. Fortunately, Toledo's dancers have formed a wonderful friendship with the dancers of St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church in Ann Arbor. For the past few years some of our Hellenic Dancers attend spring rehearsals and dance in the Ann Arbor Greek Festival that takes place the beginning of June. In turn, some of the Ann Arbor (AA) dancers travel to Toledo rehearsals and dance as Hellenic Dancers in our festival. This is a mutually beneficial arrangement. There have been instances where AA dance captains instruct the Toledo dancers.



## ADDITIONAL GREEK LANGUAGE OPPORTUNITY March 1, 2017, SAVE THE DATE!






## Orthodoxy 101

His sights set on God and his life grounded in the Church, Father Arseny lived by injunction to 'bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ' (Galatians 6:2). This narrative, compiled from accounts of Father Arseny's spiritual children and others whom he brought to God, gives stirring glimpses of his life in prison camp and after his release. It also tells the stories of people whose lives, often during times of almost unimaginable crisis, were touched and transfigured through their connection with Father Arseny. Emerging from the context of the particular tragedies of Soviet Russia, this book carries a universal impact certain to be felt by readers in the West today.




