President's Update by Denny Lawrence

Update on Parish Council Goals for 2016: At our April Parish Assembly meeting, I identified three parish council goals for 2016. Our first goal was to repair roof leaks in the educational building. Emmanuel Yakumithis and George Veronie worked together to complete this project.

Our second goal was to identify what repairs are needed to stop the water leaks in our Cathedral roof and to begin the repair process. The initial contract to begin the repair process was presented by Paul Sieben at the October Parish Assembly. Parish Assembly approved the expenditure of up to \$100,000 from the Endowment Fund to finance the initial repair contract.

Now that we have retired our Community Center mortgage, we need to refocus our efforts on stewardship — this is our third parish council goal. Kathy Chaka and the Stewardship Committee have begun that process this year and it will continue for the foreseeable future.

Bequest by Peter Athanas: Earlier this year, Holy Trinity received a check for \$325,000 from the estate of Peter Athanas. We recently received the second and final bequest from Peter's estate for \$405,000. These bequests have been placed in the Endowment Fund. Our intent is to use Peter's gift as the primary means of financing repairs to our Cathedral. May his memory be eternal.

Highlight of the 43rd Clergy/Laity Congress in Nashville, Tennessee: At the opening ceremony His Eminence, Archbishop Demetrios, presented his convention report and collectively provided the Congress with three tasks:

- 1. How do we educate our parishioners in God's teachings? We need to be able to talk about our faith. When you talk about orthodoxy to a non-orthodox, you must know what to say what is our message? Why do you come to church?
- 2. How do we reach out those who show up at church once or twice a year and get them to become more active in our ministries? (1.2 million Orthodox Christians in the US only 22,000 attend service regularly).
- 3. How do we reach out those who do not have a church?

His Eminences' tasks became clearer when we recently attended the National Ministry and Evangelism Conference in Portland, Oregon: The theme of the conference, "Bringing Orthodoxy to America", calls for all parishes to become more engaged in the important work of Outreach and Evangelism.

We learned that religion is becoming less important in today's society. Twenty-five percent (25%) of Americans say they are unaffiliated with any religious organization. Thirty-nine percent (39%) of millennials (age 18-35) are now nonaffiliated. Sixty percent (60%) of children raised in nonreligious homes remain nonreligious in adulthood. Eighty percent (80%) of churches in the USA have reached a plateau or are declining. The good news is 20% of the churches in the USA are growing!

The conferences were a "wakeup call" and an important first step in identifying the challenges we are facing as Orthodox Christians. Each parish likely needs to assess their current status, create a vision of where they want to be in the next 7-10 years, and develop a plan to achieve those goals.

BYZANTINE MUSIC FELLOWSHIP by Elainie Lillios



Holy Trinity's Byzantine Music Fellowship continues practicing on Tuesday evenings 7-8pm, working on music for the Paraklesis service to the Theotokos. We are a great group of enthusiastic singers, but we need more

men or women willing to sing "Ison"! Help Frank Reder and Michael Thompson with this important role by joining us on Tuesday nights. Not sure what "Ison" is? Read an excerpt from an article by Christina Stavros explaining its significance in Byzantine chanting:

"Musically speaking, there are only two parts in Byzantine music—ison and melos. Melos (melody) takes the profound language of our hymnology and "clothes" it in kerygmatic melody so as to preach and proclaim the text. The ison is the note that sets the mode (tone) and is "held" while the text of the verses and hymns are chanted by the melodist (or many melodists in a choir together.) Ison is very difficult because it requires a singular, focused determination to be strong and stay in one place—tonally speaking—while the melodist is moving all around the scale. The ison is often neglected because it is very difficult and perceived as unnecessary. But ison is essential to what is happening in Byzantine music. It is like a throne that provides a "seat" for the melody so that it does not lose its way and fall down. Ison is the framework for the melody—a non-negotiable aspect of Byzantine Music." -- Christina Stavros from "Christ is Our Ison: Byzantine Music and the Orthodox Family" on the Greek Orthodox Church of America website: goarch.org

October was a fun month for HOPE and JOY. Last month we kicked-off our year with an outing to Erie Orchards. The kids (and parents) had a great time!


During our monthly meeting the HOPE and JOY group began their year with a focus on Gratitude. Our theme for the year will be learning to be grateful for all the things we





It also tells the stories of people whose lives, often during times of almost unimaginable crisis, were touched and transfigured through their connection with Father Arseny. 


