HOLY SATURDAY, by Angela Doll Carson, author of the Nearly Orthodox Blog

Will you be there?

The question came from a friend as I was leaving the Good Friday service and then, from someone else today, this Holy Saturday, through Facebook.

Yes. I will be there.

I cannot tell you how good it is to be asked this question. For me, spending a lot of time on the edges of social gatherings, church meetings, any kind of event that requires me to "be" there in person, it's amazing how good it feels to be wanted, to be included, to be welcomed.

When I was chrismated finally after a few years of plodding along the first thing someone said to me was "welcome home!" and in that moment, I probably broke down a little. It is home. I do feel welcome. That welcome came from the people who reached out hands to me when I was new and feeling overwhelmed. It kept me coming back.

The beauty of the Orthodox church, the liturgy, the calendar, the rhythm of "Lord, have mercy" ringing through streams of incense is undeniable. I'd wager, though, that the true beauty, the fullness of the faith is demonstrated best within a community. It is not enough to practice the prayers, the fasting, the doctrines, we need each other. Will you be there?

The Holy Week finds us gathering at the Last Supper, witnessing the washing of the apostles' feet, standing at the foot of the cross of the crucified Christ and then at the tomb as his body is laid within. We stand together in these moments, and we stand then too, awestruck when the stone is rolled away, confused in the cold of night and then joyous when we say to another person, "Christ is Risen!" and joyous when we hear the response, "Indeed, He is risen!"

Will you be there? I hope so. Be there, and enter in.

Community Cookbook by Phyllis Manton

Greetings. By now we are half way through our Lenten Journey. The question of what to eat, or what to cook becomes a challenge if people want to abstain from meat, oil, and dairy. The choice to do so is entirely personal. Oftentimes people get caught up in the food rules and forget that fasting is one part of Great Lent. The other parts of Lent are prayer and good works and of course how we treat others.

"When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show others they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that it will not be obvious to others that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen; and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you."

I include that passage because I always stumble during Lent.

I continue to be pleasantly surprised by the creative Lenten dishes people put together. Our Community Cookbook has so many tasty recipes that are tried and true. Most of the ingredients are things we have in our kitchens. Substitutions and variations work when you're out of an ingredient or two. For example, if you're out of vinegar for salad or vegetables, lemon juice is an excellent substitute. If you want to use up that bag of mixed baby kales before it expires use it as you would to make spinach and rice, (spanakorizo). The shrimp pilafs we love so much can include other seafood like mussels and oysters.

The Community Cook Book has been given a great deal of tender loving care and our experts have edited errors to create and even better book. I am fortunate to be on this team that exhibits love of faith, family, friends, and of course, food. Kali Anastasi to everyone.

Stewardship Report - General Assembly March 19, 2017 Kathy Chaka/Stewardship Chairman

I. How is Stewardship calculated?

Since the adoption of Stewardship as our giving program over 20 years ago, it is common practice for Stewardship to include donations from:

- a. Pledges/Commitment Cards
- b. Christmas
- c. Easter
- d. Flowers

II. 2016 End-of-Year Report ...

In the January ECHO article we stated that we ended the 2016 Stewardship Campaign with 285 stewards. However, when all was counted and calculated and some last minute stewards generously gave their stewardship, we were very proud to announce that our community ended the 2016 Stewardship Campaign with 300 Stewards, with Total Offerings of \$237,931.28 As a basis for comparison... at the close of the 2015 Stewardship Campaign, we had 300 Stewards, with Total Offerings of \$221,560

These numbers are significant, in that the same amount of stewards from 2015 to 2016, recognizing the needs of this Cathedral, increased their giving by \$16,000!!!

III. 2017 Stewardship Report... (January 1 – February 28)

- A. 170 Stewards have filled out Commitment Cards pledging \$159,372; \$51, 353 has been collected
- B. 21 additional Stewards are participating in the Stewardship of our Church but have not filled out Commitment Cards.
- C. The total Stewardship to date is 191 Stewards with \$54,991 collected.

IV. Message from the Stewardship Committee...

Our challenge to everyone is to continue spreading the word about the good works happening here at Holy Trinity. We will measure our success this year by the number of new people that we welcome into or back to our Church. We encourage everyone to embrace our Stewardship program and make a commitment in some way to our beloved Holy Trinity Cathedral. What we are doing here at Holy Trinity is working, and it is helping to preserve this Church for generations to come!
