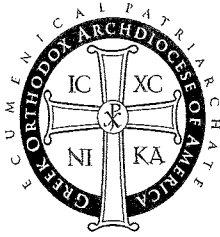

Dear Parish Family and Friends,

Last month we celebrated the feast of the Ascension. After our Lord ascended we heard these words, "And they worshipped him, and they returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God." In the past, I have had a hard time understanding where the joy is to be found in this separation. Many of you may not know this about me, but I have always had a hard time being separated from family and saying goodbye. When I left my family to go to seminary, I had an extremely hard time saying goodbye to them. I was certainly excited to start my time at school but I was nervous about how I would do without the support of my family and friends. So I wondered where the joy was to be found in saying goodbye to the very person who said to his disciple's, "No longer do I call you servants, but I have called you friends..." I have come to realize that they found joy in the fact that when the Lord ascended He did so in His humanity. By doing that he opened to us, all of us, the gates to Paradise. The joy is found in the fact that the Lord's mission here on earth was complete. Their joy and ours is found in the realization that we can grow in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior and the Love of God the Father through the Holy Spirit that was promised, and sent by the Son after His Resurrection and Ascension. All of this could only have happened after He left and after He separated himself from the disciples.

Father Anthony Coniaris once wrote, "He goes away in order to change the form by which he will work among us. Now He will work through us, the Spirit-filled, Christ-filled members of His body, the Church". In this we find great joy. Joy because you and I have been chosen to continue the work of Christ. Joy coming from the fact that we, each of us, with your different strengths and talents are needed to continue the work of the Church. As your priest I find joy as well knowing that many of you have already taken up this call to serve Christ and His Church. You have accepted this call as Sunday School teachers, Parish Council members, volunteers at the festival, volunteers at the summer lunches, the list goes on and on. I am joyful for those of you who are thinking about different ways we can do more to reach out to our members and those who we may not have seen for a while. I am joyful and thankful.

As we look to the summer and wind down our ministries, I pray that we continue to open our hearts to the Holy Spirit working within us. I pray we continue to open ourselves to being "Spirit-filled, Christ-filled members of His body." That we may help each other find the joy that the Apostles had as they gazed upon the Ascension of our Lord.

Holy Trinity Cookbook by Phyllis Manton

Spring is about us and summer is around the corner. Spring is about renewal of the earth and faith and all that comes forth from the ground. Spring vegetables are delicious. Artichokes, artichokes, artichokes, a specialty of ours. Check out Irene Karahalios', Peas and Artichokes A La Greek. Or Alice Roberts' Artichokes a la Constantinople. The combinations of herbs, olive oil and vegetables makes an especially tasty dish that can be a meal! Braised lamb (or chicken) and artichokes with avgolemono sauce is another dish to wow your taste buds. Everything tastes tangy and special with avgolemono.

Peas and asparagus are spring vegetables that go with many meals. As the summer season unfolds we have pages of recipes for baked vegetables and vegetable stews. Some call it Tourlou or Briami depending on one's region of Greece but one thing is for sure all the dishes are delicious. As small as Greece is in comparison to other countries its diversity in dishes is astounding. From the remote mountain villages to the tiniest islands every family cooked with the resources available and made the most of each ingredient to create memorable foods. Each island of Greece has its own specialty and each region from mountain top to city has the same.

I must include this tidbit in honor of spring. I grew up eating dandelion greens. They are a bit bitter but tasty and so very good for you. Recently I read about the mighty dandelion. I spent many hours as a child with my Yiayia digging dandelions from remote fields in Sylvania, which are now housing developments. My Pappou would drink the juice from the boiled greens. He was onto something. Dandelions are filled with antioxidants like vitamin C, Luteolin, calcium and fiber. Their bitterness has properties good for the kidneys, the liver and the gallbladder. The sap of the dandelion is good for the skin. This humble flower has much going for it.

The other weed we call glistrida, is called purslane in English. Pick them (wash them!) and eat them! They are also full of nutrients and flavor. They are great raw in salads that are so abundant this time of year!

Our Toledo Museum of Art has the rare opportunity this summer of hosting an exhibition of Ancient Greek vases. It is an unusual event that so many vases will be on exhibit together in one place. Our TMA is one of the few places where we get to see these exquisite works of art. The museum store will be selling our community cookbook *Olives, Feta, Phyllo & More*, as well.

Stewardship contributions are 83,366.

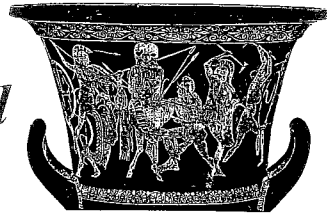

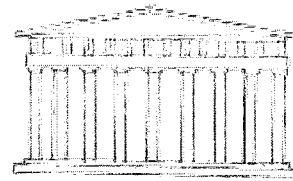
The Berlin Painter and His World

July 7–October 1, 2017



The Berlin Painter and His World will examine constructions of style in early fifth-century Attic vase-painting, with a focus on the Berlin Painter, a seminal red-figure artist whose elegant paintings provide a vital window on Athenian society in the period of the Persian Wars. The artist is known for his large, dramatic red figures set against a stark black background. The Berlin Painter is recognized as a master of fine details, but his major innovation was in allowing the vessel itself—its shape and form, its curves and colors—to serve as the backdrop for his elegant scenes and figures. Style and attribution will be the central themes of this show, but the project also will attempt to place the Berlin Painter's oeuvre in historical and archaeological contexts, providing visitors a unique perspective into the art of ancient Greece.

Featuring approximately 85 objects drawn from some of the most important collections in the world, including the Staatliche Museen zu Berlin, the Musée du Louvre, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the British Museum, and the Vatican Museums, among others, this international exhibition will be the first devoted to the Berlin Painter and to the enduring importance of connoisseurship and attribution in the study of Attic vase-painting. The exhibition is organized by the Princeton University Art Museum, where it will open in March 2017, before it travels to Toledo for a summer to fall installation. Toledo will be the second and only other venue for the exhibition. It will be installed in the Glass Pavilion, which will make the already stunning vases look truly exceptional. Never before has an exhibition of ancient pottery been displayed in such an open and natural setting; it will be a must-see for ancient art lovers.
