As the year comes to a close, I would like to thank each and every one of you for your support and involvement in the progress that we shared for the betterment of Holy Trinity. Very soon work will begin in the Cathedral to repair the damage that occurred during the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. We have also secured an iconographer to do repair work of the Icons of the Evangelists which were also damaged. We are progressing on our plans to make our cathedral ADA compliant and accessible to our parish. Once we have solid costs, we will present the plans to the Parish Assembly. We have gone out for a review and request for proposal on our investment funds. Now that we have a better idea of the costs to repair the Cathedral, we can make decisions on how to invest long term rather than remaining liquid as we had due to the unknown costs to make the necessary repairs. Our By-Law Committee has been working very hard to bring our By-Laws up to date. The last official changes were made in 1994. Once the updates are made, approved by the parish and the Metropolitan, the plan is to review every other year to keep them up to date.

We continue to move in the right direction. Stewardship numbers are up. The number of parishioners present at the Divine Liturgy are increasing and we have a large number of Altar Boys participating in the Divine Liturgy every week. Our ministries are flourishing under the leadership of Father Larry, and as we all know behind every good man is a good woman. Thanks to Presbytera Jenny for all of her efforts (many times unseen) and her direct support of many of the ministries.

To end the year on a high note, I would like to announce that Holy Trinity has entered into an agreement with the City of Toledo to lease the Summit Street parking lot and the small lot next to the Cathedral for a period of three years. This will not affect the Greek American Festival as we have negotiated that in our lease agreement. This is currently a short term situation and I caution that we not get used to this cash influx, but treat it as a blessing and utilize it accordingly.

I would like to thank my fellow parish council members, Carole and Terry for all of their help. Each and every one helped make Holy Trinity better and helped me accomplish many things this year. It really does take a team.

Finally, I wish to all of you and your families a very Merry Christmas and a happy and healthy New Year.



## Hellenic Dance Company Hosts Annual Breakfast. 100th Anniversary Album is presented to Parish.

While the weather outside was frosty on Youth Sunday, November 12<sup>th</sup>, spirits were warm-hearted and festive inside the Educational Building as 150+ of the congregation stayed after Liturgy to enjoy a sumptuous breakfast buffet. The annual fund-raiser, sponsored by Hellenic Dance Co., was the finale to Holy Trinity's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration.

Persilla Zervos, Director of Hellenic Dance Co., noted in her opening remarks that the group had initiated the yearlong festivities in July 2014, by hosting a lunch which welcomed Fr. Larry Legakis and his family to the parish. She thanked parishioners for their support and for the food and monetary donations today. She also thanked her teaching staff, comprised of Maria Tzanakis, Ted Voudouris, January Theodorou, Paula Apostolou and Christiana Christides, along with the dancers and their parents, for their commitment and dedication to the four folk dance groups which perform at not only the parish's Greek Festival but also other civic events. Hellenic Dance Co. has evolved into a major youth ministry within the parish. Hundreds of parish youth have participated in the program. Dancers learn about their ethnic heritage through its dances, while learning to work together as a team, offering their time and energy in support of their parish. She mentioned that the dance program was open to anyone in the Toledo community.

Ted Voudouris headed the chefs for the breakfast buffet which included Randy Bollin, Eric Deason, Randy Lizcano and Evan Zink. The breakfast was served by many of the young dancers. Kathy Chaka helped with the set-up and provided beautiful table decorations of maroon and gold.

Changing hats to Chairperson of the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Commemorative Album Committee, Persilla commented that "Although the parish's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was celebrated in June 2015, the book chronicling that event is now ready and will be distributed today. Since the Hellenic Dance Company initiated the year-long 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary by hosting its first event in July, 2014 to welcome Fr. Larry and his family, it was fitting that the dance group host the last event on Youth Sunday. The theme of the anniversary was *Honor the past. Embrace the future*, and our children are our future." Further, she noted, "I was one of the three parishioners who produced the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary album. Don Stathulis, Gus Bellas and I would joke about who would be around to produce the 100<sup>th</sup>. Sadly, I'm the only one left. I miss my fellow Cephalonian, Don, and my boyfriend, Gus."

Chris J. Zervos, the book's author-editor, said that it had been his honor to write the book — to revisit the parish throughout its many generations and to say to posterity, "We were here." The book, he said, "is a fitting tribute to the remarkable men and women who preceded us and to those of us who continue in our parish mission today. To those who will follow us, it is a road map for you." The book's central theme, he said, "is faith, hope and unity: our Cathedral family." He acknowledged his helpers on the project who provided their time and memories to identify the people in all the pictures, who proof-read the drafts and final copy.

In particular, he acknowledged Miss Lucy Hatzinikolis, who received a resounding applause, Lisa Arvanitis, Irene Kaufman, Penny Perris, Alex Tokles, Yanula Stathulis, Jim Veronie, Carole Faoiz, Connie Mynihan and his wife, Persilla. He recognized Bob Lubell, the professional photographer who shot and donated many of the magnificent interior shots of Holy Trinity's cathedral edifice used in the book. Terry Perris, a member of the Board of Trustees of the Toledo-Lucas County Public Library, accepted the book for Clyde Scoles, Library Director. Throughout the project, Chris said, he was guided by the spirit of Gus Bellas and Don Stathulis, authors of the 50<sup>th</sup> and 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary albums.

Persilla Zervos invited Fr. Larry Legakis and Parish Council President Monnie Yakumithis to the front, along with the Steering Committee members of the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration: Co-Chairmen Kathy and Bryan Chaka, Karen and Mike George, former Council Presidents, George Sares and Denny Lawrence, and honorary advisors, Yanula Stathulis and Presvytera Ann Hadgigeorge for the late Fr. Chris Hadgigeorge. Chris Zervos presented the first two copies of the book entitled *The Story of a Greek Orthodox Community, Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral 1915-2015* to Fr. Larry and Monnie Yakumithis, as the clergy and lay leaders of the parish, while Persilla distributed copies of the book to the assembled Steering Committee members.

Persilla announced to the Steering Committee that her committee had completed its assignment; the book was completed and ready for distribution today. She continued by saying, "Some thought the book would never be finished. But here it is, a hard-bound, color-printed book with 368 pages and 1800 pictures. The project even made a profit." She presented a giant check for \$25,000 to Council President Yakumithis. Kathy Chaka, General Co-Chairperson of the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary gala asked the congregation to join her in offering congratulations to Chris Zervos for his time, research and creative effort in writing this book.
