

As we can see from the loss that comes from a "rainy" festival, we realize now more than ever that Stewardship MUST be the main means from which we sustain our Church and meet our yearly operating costs. It truly is essential that we all work together to the best of our abilities to provide for the future of our beloved Holy Trinity.

In an effort to always be transparent with regard to Stewardship, the following is the breakdown for giving during this 2018 Stewardship Campaign:

Pledging \$250.00	and below	61 Stewards
Pledging \$251.00) - \$499.00	37 Stewards
Pledging \$500.00	999.00	56 Stewards
Pledging \$1,000.	00 - \$2,999.00 .	74 Stewards
Pledging \$3,000.	00 and above	10 Stewards

The average giving of a Parishioner is approximately \$907.

As of this printing, 86 Parishioners have increased their giving, 28 Parishioners have decreased their giving, and 93 Parishioners have stayed the same.

As can be seen by the above numbers, we are making a difference and we want to end this 2018 Stewardship Campaign on an all-time high!

HELLENIC DANCE COMPANY 2018 GREEK FESTIVAL

The show must go on...

Rain didn't stop the 4 groups of the Hellenic Dance Company for performing on schedule during the 3 day festival. The Hellenic Dance Company's Mission is to promote our Greek heritage and culture through the teaching and performance of our Greek heritage dances. The dance company is made up of 4 age groups; the Ellinopedia, Asteria, Olympians and Hellenic Dancers.

The Ellinopedia, the dance company's youngest group, (who may sometimes be more interested in playing "Duck, Duck, Goose" than rehearsing) did an outstanding job performing their repertoire of 5 dances. So we ask the dancers and their parents if their children can be members of two groups. This also entails performing twice each day of the festival. This way we stabilize each group. Transition dancers help the younger group by leading and staying on beat. The dance company also uses "dance helpers" who are from an older group to help with a younger group. Asteria Dancers that helped with the Ellinopedia program were **Zoe Bollin, Charlotte Lizcano and Billy Plomaritis.**

The **Asteria Dancers** make up the next group and perform without assistance from the dance instructors. Their program is made up of more intricate dances and choreography. Asteria also performed their program of 7 dances on Saturday inside the Summit Street foyer of the Educational Building but they were able to perform outside on both Friday and Saturday. The Asteria

Dancers were Zoe Bollin, Demi Deason, Electra Hickman, Gus Jackson, Caede Karavas, Charlotte Lizcano, Francessca Lizcano, Steven Owen, Billy Plomaritis, Laila Proestos, Zachary Proestos, Nikko Theodorou and Alexandra Xenofontos.

The Olympians Dancers make up the third group and this is where instruction is not only about learning the steps to a dance but encouraging dancers to understand what is involved in leading their group. These lessons continue to the advanced level of the Hellenic Dancers. The Olympians because of record rain on Sunday performed around the perimeter of the hall in the Educational Building, again, an indication of their maturity as performers.

Friday night's performance stood out as the group was able to again perform the Tsamiko tower (the first group in the country to coordinate the two tier addition to the dance). The rain stopped long enough on Saturday for the Hellenic Dancers to perform but without their traditional heritage costumes. (Water splashing up from the parking lot would have necessitated expensive dry cleaning). I always enjoy watching previous year's Hellenic Dancers slip into the performance because everyone is in street clothes. Since "the show must go on" - an abbreviated Sunday show was performed around the perimeter of the Educational Building hall. All the Hellenic Dancers performances were spectacular!!

The Hellenic Dancers performed three different shows at this year's festival.
