As I write this short note to you the sun is shining brightly. The world outside my window is beginning to come alive as spring starts to show itself. Dear Youth Ministry Families,

- 5. Read good books that teach kids about keeping the faith.

- Purchase books about the saints, or this Bible story book: <u>The</u> <u>Bible For Young People</u>.






