## OPA-YASOU NEWS-Fall 2019

## The Holy Trinity's Hellenic Dance Company is honored to be hosting the first Metropolis of Detroit Folk Dance Festival which will take place in Toledo October 11-13, 2019. More information will be forthcoming.

Record crowds attended Holy Trinity Cathedral 3 day Greek Festival under warm, sunny skies. The culmination of our parish's summer folk dance program was the spectacular performances provided by the 4 groups of our parish's Hellenic Dance Company. The Hellenic Dance Company's Mission is to promote our Greek heritage and culture through the teaching and performance of Greek heritage folk dances. The dance company is comprised of the Ellinopedia, Asteria, Olympians and Hellenic Dancers.

The youngest and entry level dance group is the ELLINOPEDIA (the "Greek-kids"). This is the first year of dance for many of these youngsters. We start the season by playing games and learning to skip. Most children know how to gallop (skipping/hopping on one leg) but a key to traditional Greek dances is skipping. We continue promoting skipping through the Asteria and Olympian dance groups. Some dancers can't skip. That's alright- we just show them that they can raise one foot while standing on the ball of their other foot. It works! We don't turn anyone away. We also attempt to teach left from right, counting steps, staying in line and dancing within a circle. Monday night rehearsals may be chaotic but put a costume on, lead them to the dance floor and this group puts on a great performance. It indicates that even our youngest parishioners are able to contribute to the success of the Greek Festival.

The Ellinopedia Dance Group Program included the Tsakonikos, Mermigas, Hasapikos, Marinella and Syrtaki dances. Members of the group were Lukia

Legakis, Sebastian Lizcano, Olivia MacLaren Harringan, Sophia MacLaren Harrington, Preston Schwartz, Jackson Simko, Teddy Theodorou, Evangelia Tsaousis, Nicoletta Tsaousis, Andreana Xenofontos and Maria Yakumithis. Helpers were Zoe Bollin and Charlotte Lizcano.

Our next group is the ASTERIA (the "Stars"). This group learns to dance on their own (without instructors in the circle or line directing their steps). The group performed the Karsilamas, Pontian Kotsari, Syrtos Sta Dio, Tsirigotikos, Cypriot Spoon and Sword Dance, Tsamikos and Hasaposervikos. The Asteria dancers included Zoe Bollin, Demi Deason, Electra Hickman, Gus Jackson, Francessca Lizcano, Nikko Marinis, Steven Owen, Laila Proestos, Zachary Proestos, Elias Sares, George Sares, Teddy Theodorou, Alexandria Xenofontos and Mariam Xenofontos.

The dance routines the OLYMPIAN Dance group performs are more difficult and entail hand and face movements along with intricate choreography. Their dance leaders are taking responsibility for how the dance travels on stage and the importance of the second person in line. Their program included the following 8 dances: Naxos line dance, Kliestos, Arapikos, Zonaradikos, Zagorisios, Cretan Pentazali, Tsamikos and Hasaposervikos.

Olympian Dancers were Natalie Arvanitis, Amalia Bollin, Scott Deason, Maria Dionyssopoulos (from St. George, Southgate), Evvie Jackson, Vassi Legakis, Charlotte Lizcano, Veronica Lizcano, Karris Marinis, Bella Matthews, Gus Matthews, Kalli McCullough, Zachary Proestos and Nikko Theodorou.

HELLENIC DANCERS -Our parish takes great pride in these young men and women. The Hellenic Dance group is a professional dance troupe which not only performs at our parish functions but also is hired to perform at other festivals and public events in Toledo and other cities in Ohio, Michigan and Indiana. Dancers return from college, take time off work or stay up late to do their homework so they can rehearse and perform in the festival. They also worked two 4-hour shifts besides their performances. Male/Female Dance Captains besides instructing younger or new dancers also offer suggestions on choreography, dance partners and which dances will be performed. The group's 3 day performances are always a "crowd pleaser."

A goal of the Hellenic Dance Company is to promote social interaction, communication, and learning by welcoming anyone that wants to learn the dances of their Greek Heritage and is willing to attend summer
rehearsals and perform in the festival. The past few years has seen a collaborative relationship between St. Nicholas Church in Ann Arbor, Michigan and Toledo's Holy Trinity as their dancers rehearse and perform together in each other's festivals. Last year saw second generation dancers from Holy Trinity Church in Ft. Wayne, Indiana participate in our program. This year a family from St. George Church in Southgate, Michigan asked to join.

The philosophy of the Hellenic Dance Company is that Greek folk dancing is not static. Ever since Greeks emigrated to other countries traditional Greek folk dances have evolved. A mixing of Greeks from the mainland and islands has contributed to creativity and improvisation within the confines of each dance routine. Festival patrons were impressed by the group's exciting 13 dance performance. Dances performed were the Issos, Gaida, Techno Pentazali, Koulouriotikos, Kotsaki Zazou, Toledo's very own Peloponnese Couples' Dance, Softka, Cretan Malevisiotikos, Dance of the Potiri, Zembekikos, Ikariotikos, Tsamikos and Techno Zorba. This performance included 3 male/female couple dances. We have always had an over-abundance of female dancers. Since many of our experienced female dancers are able to perform female or male choreography two females dancing together as a couple has never posed a problem. This year's dance season for the first time had more males than females. Three Olympian females put in double the rehearsal time so that Hellenic male dancers could participate in all the couple dances.

Highlight of the male Hellenic Dancers performance was the Tsamikos Tower. While performing the Tsamikos four male dancers form a tight circle while 4 more climb up their shoulders and form a second tier. This year's "bases" were Vasili Dionyssopoulos, Georgios Kamilaris, Dimitri Karahalios and Logan Theodorou. Second tier "flyers" were Frank Bairactaris, Peter Cook, Marios Kamilaris and Dimitri Skrettas. Nichole Kanios reprised her Tsamikos performance showing that a women can also do the Tsamikos' high kicks and close to the ground circle pivot.

This year's female Hellenic Dancers were Natalie Arvanitis (also an Olympic Dancer), Amalia Bollin (also an Olympic Dancer), Alexandra Chalogiannis (from St. Nicholas, Ann Arbor), Marina Govatsos (from St. Nicholas, Ann Arbor), Helena Karahalios (from Holy Trinity, Ft. Wayne), Veronica Lizcano, (also Olympic Dancer), Athena Mitsopooulos, Theodora Mitsopooulos, Anastacia Papageorgiou, (from St. Nicholas, Ann Arbor), Mia Skrettas (from St. Nicholas, Ann Arbor), Georgia Stamatopoulos (from St. Nicholas, Ann Arbor), and Marianna Temple.

Male Hellenic Dancers were Frank Bairactaris (from St. Nicholas, Ann Arbor), Jackson Bollin, Seraphim Dionyssopoulos (from St. George, Southgate), Vasili Dionyssopoulos (from St. George, Southgate), Davis Jenkins, Georgios Kamilaris, Dimitri Karahalios (from Holy Trinity, Ft. Wayne), Nicholas Legakis, Kip Papageorgiou (from St. Nicholas, Ann Arbor) and Dimitri Skrettas (from St. Nicholas, Ann Arbor).
