Dear Parish Family and Friends,
As I write this letter we are in the middle of the month of November. It is during this month every year that the Nativity of our Lord is announced. Secularly, it is announced on the airways with the Christmas songs that we hear. We are reminded that it is time to begin buying gifts for friends and family. The malls are beginning to get even more full and busy with all the different sales offered in order to get us through the door. Things are beginning to get a bit hectic. Then I am reminded of the words of the Angels to the shepherds, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will among men!" At times it feels like finding the peace the angels are talking about is difficult. Yet, this is what our Lord came as child to give us. It is this peace that we have to seek during this busy season.

There is a story I want to share with you about peace. "There once was a King who offered a prize to the artist who would paint the best picture of peace. Many artists tried. The King looked at all the pictures, but there were only two he really liked and he had to choose between them. One picture was of a calm lake. The lake was a perfect mirror, for peaceful towering mountains were all around it. Overhead was a blue sky with fluffy white clouds. All who saw this picture thought that it was a perfect picture of peace. The other picture had mountains too. But these were rugged and bare. Above was an angry sky from which rain fell and in which lightening played. Down the side of the mountain tumbled a foaming waterfall. This did not look peaceful at all. But when the King looked, he saw behind the waterfall a tiny bush growing in a crack in the rock. In the bush a mother bird had built her nest. There, in the midst of the rush of angry water, sat the mother bird on her nest... perfect peace. Which picture do you think won the prize? The King chose the second picture. "Because," explained the King, "peace does not mean to be in a place where there is no noise, trouble, or hard work. Peace means to be in the midst of all those things and still be calm in your heart. That is the real meaning of peace."

My friends and my family, as we prepare to receive Christ the days ahead will be hectic. It may not always be easy to find peace. It is important that we remember that Christ came to give us peace even in the midst of noise and chaos. We need only keep Him as our focus so that as St. Paul says, "The peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."
