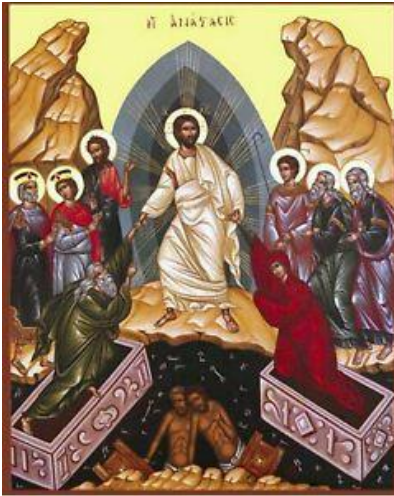

President's Message by Emmanuel T. Yakumithis

My dear fellow parishioners,

CHRIST IS RISEN! I want to thank Father Larry, our wonderful chanters, altar boys, choir members for their exceptional commitment during this Lenten Season and especially Holy Week.

On April 1, we had our Parish Assembly meeting. We discussed several topics including the construction project which is moving forward on time and on budget. Paul Sieben has been in constant contact with the project manager and has really helped to keep this project on track. Once the addition is complete, we will move on to the next step which is converting the office behind the Pangari to a multipurpose room (Koliva prep, cry room, etc) and a refurbishment of the basement restrooms and flooring. I know that some of our parishioners questioned the timing of the project, but typically over the winter months attendance is lighter and the parish council felt that with attendance down AND covid restrictions, we were inconveniencing the fewest people possible.

We had another record-breaking year in stewardship thanks to all of you and your continued support. I am in contact with numerous parishes in and outside of our Metropolis and there are quite a few parishes that will not exist after 2021 because of the impact of "distance worship". We have been blessed to have a generous community. With less stewards than last year, we still exceeded our goal and because of all of you, we will be able to continue supporting our ministries, pay our bills and be here for the next generation.

Finally, after many conversations with members of our parish, the parish council, the city of Toledo and the State of Ohio, we have decided to forgo the festival for one more year and present the Taste of Greece, drive thru event. The current distancing guidelines allow us to open, but from a practical standpoint, we are so regulated that it is a logistical impossibility. I can speak for the entire parish council when I say that no one is happy with this decision, but we know that this is the safest route for our health, safety and finances. As I told those who attended the parish assembly, the overhead costs of the festival to open are almost half of the cost of the entire construction project. That's a lot of money to put at risk, when the government changes the rules almost daily.

As we move forward and begin to lighten restrictions, please feel free to reach out to me with any questions, concerns or suggestions.

On Sunday, March 28th 2021 our Greek School celebrated two important holidays. One is the religious solemnity of The Annunciation of the Virgin Mary where Archangel Gabriel announced to the Virgin Mary that she was God's chosen one to bring into the world His Son, Jesus Christ, the Savior of mankind. The other holiday is a National one, when the Greeks, who had been enslaved by the Turks for 400 years, on March 25th 1821 revolted with whatever means they had, and after a lengthy struggle with the dream of Freedom or Death, they won their Independence. We should all pay our respect and gratitude to the Heroes who fought for the freedom of Greece and glorified the Greek Nation. The revolution of March 25th 1821 is a milestone for Hellenism and one of the most admired achievements of the Greeks.

The Greek Revolution may be over, but constant Vigilance is the price of Freedom. We pray today for our country and freedom-loving people all over the World and for a just and peaceful solution of the Cyprus problem, although the Republic of Cyprus in 2010 celebrated its 50th year since it's founding in 1960.

This year Greece is celebrating the Bicentennial (200 years) of Greek Independence Day. We were honored with the presence of our Honorable Mayor of Toledo Mr. Wade Kapszukiewicz, who was introduced to the parish by our Honorable Parish President Mr. Emmanuel T. Yakumithis. The Honorable Mayor was an eloquent speaker and a true Philhellene.

Our Greek School program followed, leading with the parade of the Greek, American, and Cypriot Flags held by Nicholas Legakis, Alex Yakumithis, and Vasilia Legakis with our students and mothers following. We would like to thank our Choir Director, Jo-Anne Chrysochoos, and Organist, Andreea Lee, who led the singing of the Greek and American National Anthems accompanied by the parishioners and students.

Our warmest congratulations to the mothers for their informative speeches about the Annunciation and the struggle for Greek Independence: Elena Xenofontos in Greek, Alexia Hickman in English, and Presbyteria Jenny Legakis in English identifying the American Philhellenes and others who inspired those who made the Greek Revolution of 1821 possible. God Bless the United States of America! ΖΗΤΩ ΤΟ 1821!

Warmest congratulations also to our students who recited National poems in Greek: Vasilia and Loukia Legakis about «Το Κρυφό Σχολειό» (“To Krifo Scholio”), «Το Φεγγαράκι μου Λαμπρό» (“To Feggarakki Mou Lambro”), and «Από το Καινούργιο το Σχολειό θα βγει η Ελλάδα η Μεγάλη» (“Apo to

Kainourgio to Scholio tha vgi I Ellada I Megali”); Electra Hickman about «Ο Θούριος του Ρήγα Φεραίου, καλύτερα μιάς ώρας ελεύθερη ζωή» (“O Thourios Tou Riga Fereou, kalitera mias oras eleftheri zoi”); Alexandra, Mariam and Andreeana Xenofontos who told us stories in English about the Greek Revolution, including the “Hidden Schools,” the “Dance of Zaloggo,” and the “Siege of and Exit from Mesologgi”; and little Alexander McMurray enthusiastically shouted “Ζήτω η Ελλάδα” (Long Live Greece)!

Thank you to George and Joyce Anagnos for their ongoing support to make Greek School remote learning through Zoom possible. Thank you to Fr. Larry and Parish Council for their continued support for Greek School.

Stewardship Report by Kathy Chaka

"...the Greatest of These Is Love" **Corinthians 13:13**

For those who were unable to attend the April 11th General Assembly, I'd like to offer the following Stewardship report that includes year-end totals as well as some of my personal reflections on the current 2021 Stewardship campaign. As always, continue to send in your 2021 Stewardship pledges as we work together with God's blessings to make this campaign one of the most successful ones ever.

I. 2020 Stewardship Campaign End Total ...

230 Stewards pledged and paid \$245,386
63 Stewards did not pledge, but paid \$23,421
293 Stewards paid a total of \$269,149 *Goal Achieved/ 3rd Time

II. 2019 Stewardship Campaign End Total...

265 Stewards pledged and paid \$257,858
33 Stewards did not pledge, but paid \$7,565
298 Stewards paid a total of \$265,423
*Goal Achieved/ 2nd Time

III. 2018 Stewardship Campaign reflected 286 Stewards, giving total offerings of \$252,300 *Goal Achieved/1st Time

IV. 2017 Stewardship Campaign reflected 300 Stewards, giving total offerings of \$230,954.

V. *Current 2021 Stewardship Campaign...*

181 Stewards have pledged \$210,233

These Stewards have paid to date \$82,120

41 Stewards did not pledge \$13,587

222 Stewards have paid to date a total of \$95,707

VI. *So Much to Be Thankful for...*

- Achieving our goal during a Pandemic. This can ONLY be attributed to God's Grace and the LOVE our Stewards have for this Cathedral and its preservation
- Achieving and "Increasing" our final goal by \$3,736 from the previous year during a Pandemic.
- Achieving and "Increasing" our final goal from the previous year with slightly less Stewards.

VII. *Cautiously Stepping into the Light...*

This year's 2021 Stewardship Campaign is a campaign like no other in our Church's history and we need to be very mindful of that...

- We began this campaign without the usual fanfare of a big "kickoff" Stewardship Sunday, complete with a community luncheon and a Cathedral full of parishioners eagerly placing their Stewardship envelopes in the basket to be blessed by Father Larry. Even our attempts at a drive-by Stewardship Pledge Card drop-off were thwarted by high winds and cold weather causing many Parishioners to stay home.

Concern: Out of sight, out of mind... Will Stewards send in their pledge cards? Will Stewards take advantage of the many new on-line ways to make their Stewardship commitments? Will we continue to rely on our festival for our greatest source of income and not our Stewardship program?

- We are in the middle of a beautiful Cathedral Renovation that did not require any of the traditional fundraising drives that usually accompany a renovation of this kind.

Concern: Will Stewards think that we are fine financially? We did not ask for money for the renovation, so we must not need to work on our Stewardship goals.

- We have hit our Stewardship goal for the third year in a row and even increased it. This is truly wonderful and a testament to ALL our Stewards who have worked so hard and continue to work so hard on their Stewardship Commitments.

Concern: Have Stewards noticed that we have not raised the Stewardship goal of \$250,000 for the last three years? Traditionally once campaign goals are achieved, we raise the goal each year. However, during the planning of the renovation and the subsequent Pandemic, we chose to steady our course and not rock the boat by asking our Stewards to do more during uncertain times.

- We are hitting *and increasing* these Stewardship goals with same number of Stewards, wavering just below the 300 mark.

Concern: Is our community growing? We see children having 40-day blessings, baptisms, and weddings, and this year, sadly many funerals. We know our membership lists boast close to 500 names. But reality, in Stewardship terms, is that the same people each year are the ones who are meeting and increasing their Stewardship Commitments. They are the ones who are heading the call and looking at the blessings that have been bestowed upon them and then offering those to the Church and for that, we are eternally grateful.

In closing, we pray that once the Cathedral is completely open again, it will be alive and full of old and new families, and we pray that we renew our commitment to finding and welcoming new people into our Church as we were once welcomed. It is only in

this way that our Stewardship program, and ultimately our beloved Holy Trinity, will continue to thrive and grow for future generations.

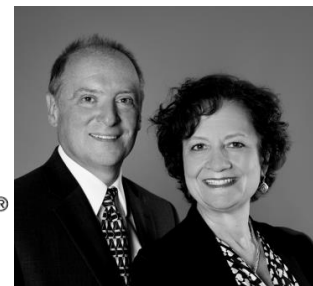
