

Greek School News by Dawn Anagnos, Director. Instructor

On Sunday, October 31st, 2021 after the Divine Liturgy, Greek School celebrated "OXI DAY." This Holiday commemorates the Greek Premier Ioannis Metaxas saying, "OXI!"-"NO!" to the Axis Forces demanding Greek surrender in the early morning hours of October 28th, 1940. The proud and brave Greek Army pushed them deep into Italy-dominated Albania. The entire world was amazed by the Greek bravery. Little Greece stood up to the giants while other countries were surrendering one after the other. Every year the 28th of October, 1940 is celebrated as a National Holiday in Greece, and abroad where Greeks live, to remind us of the "OXI Day." This is the day the Greeks rejected the Italian ultimatum, fought for freedom and justice, and won against all odds. Winston Churchill's words at the time were, "From now on we are not going to say that Greeks fight like heroes, but that heroes fight like the Greeks." The program began with the altar boys processing with the Holy Cross, the Exapteriga and the Greek, Cypriot and American flags. Thank you to altar boys Nick Legakis, Charis Besios, Andrew Ellis, Daniel Ellis, Jeremiah Yglesias, and Savvas Moraitis and to Parish Council member Steve Papadimos for the procession. After the Doxology beautifully sung by the Choir, Fr. Larry Legakis continued the program with the Choir leading the congregation in singing the American and Greek National Anthems. After that we heard the OXI DAY speeches in Greek by Stephanie Georgakopoulos, an Adult Greek School student, and in English by Presbytera Jenny Legakis. They gave beautiful and moving speeches. Many thanks and God Bless to both of you. Then the Greek School students recited poems: Lukia Legakis recited "Η Ελληνική Σημαία" ("Ι Elliniki Simea"), Vasilia Legakis recited "Το Οχι το αθάνατο" ("The immortal OXI"), and Savvas Moraitis recited "H Ελλάδα


