The President's Message by Kathy Chaka

As we journey through this Lenten period together, I believe that we continue to affirm that we have many blessings here at Holy Trinity. In the months ahead, you will see this Cathedral come alive with activity that has been years in the planning. As you heard from hopefully attending the Parish General Assembly last month, we have approved the spending for the repair of the iconography in the Cathedral, as well as the painting and carpeting of the Cathedral. This is being made possible by the very generous donation of \$120,000 from Maria Proestos and \$200,000 in monies generated by the constant donations to Holy Trinity's Memorial Fund.

We hope to begin these repairs immediately following the completion of Lent and Easter, in order to have the renovations completed by the time the Cathedral will be having summer weddings in July.

We also approved the spending of up to \$100,000 for the complete repair and reconstruction of the parking lot. The parking lot was last done over 40 years ago and this project was long overdue. Once again, the monies for this project are coming from the very generous donation of Aris Veronie and his gift to the Cathedral in the name of his parents, Irene and Jim Veronie. By the grace of God and the complete generosity of Parishioners just like you, all of this work will be done without needing to do any fundraising. Please understand that in order to do all of this work this summer, we must all be very patient, as the Cathedral will be in a state of upheaval. During this time, we will also be trying to get ready for a festival which in and of itself is always a monumental task. But the end result, will of course be a much-needed facelift if you will, for the preservation of Holy Trinity Cathedral.

I can't end without welcoming our new Ministry Coordinator, Zach Heller to Holy Trinity. Zach comes to us highly recommended by the Metropolis, and he will be a huge help to Father Larry and a great addition to all the ministries. Please go up to Zach and introduce yourself and welcome him with open arms into our community.

Vasilia Legakis Oratorical Festival Speech Topic 4; Humility in our Society

In 2009 the most popular TV show was a reality show focused on the family of Robert Kardashian, one of the lawyers for the OJ Simpson case. The same year, the humble Patriarch Pavel of Serbia passed away due to poor health. The show "keeping up with Kardashians" focuses on one group of people, the Kardashians, for even the name makes people feel obligated to "keep up" with what they are doing. While, patriarch Pavel was known as the "walking Saint" who keeps up with you, through humility and love. These two examples portray opposite sides of the humility spectrum, and will be the focus of my speech today.

Patriarch Pavel was born in 1914 in Serbia and after his parents died, was orphaned at age 6. He was then sent to live with his aunt. He went to the seminary for college and after the seminary worked as a construction worker in Belgrade, but due to poor health, took a monastic vow and joined Blagoveštenje monastery. As a bishop Pavel built many new churches and reconstructed old ones. After 33 years spent in Kosovo Pavle was elected the Patriarch of Serbia in 1990, and held the position until he died in 2009. Throughout his life Patriarch Pavle was a symbol of humility, for example once he was asked why he did not own a car and responded, "I will not purchase one until every Albanian and Serb household in Kosovo and Metohija has an automobile." Pavle put the other, less fortunate needs in front of his own. He chose to "walk" with them rather than drive ahead of them.

The Kardashians on the other hand have not shown the same love and humility. The show "Keeping up with the Kardashians has had 20 seasons, from 2007 to 2021, making it one of the longest airing reality TV shows. This show focuses on Kris Kardashian and her children: Kim, Kourtney, Khloe, Kiley and Kendall. Throughout the years the public saw their highs and lows, from funny pranks and new beginnings to failed products and scandals. But through it all they kept their image, their fighting and selfishness never left, the show was not focused on others it was plainly focused on them and how they were the best. The Kardashian-Jenner clan made billions of dollars on being vain and prideful, for they were plainly famous for being famous. Now one might think, well they are rich and famous, so it doesn't really matter. Well, the public has seen through their facade, their prideful and selfish attitudes, has resulted in hate from the public and constant ridicule. Humility is something people are appreciative of, not vanity and pride.

In Luke 18: 9-14 Jesus tells the story of the publican and the pharisee, a story of humility and forgiveness. In this parable the Pharisee stands before God and talks about how great he is and how he fast more than he is supposed to. I ask you to think of him as a Kardashian. Then on the other hand the Publican is on his knees with his head down begging God to forgive him for his sins. I ask you to think of him as Patriarch Pavel. These two examples of humility; the Publican and the Pharisee and the Kardashians and Patriarch Pavel, are very similar and can help people understand how humility works in our personal lives.

As seen through the lord's parables and my modern interpretation, one can perceive the humility and lack thereof in today's society. With all the Kardashians in the world it is sometimes very hard to pick out and be Patriarch Pavles. But we must act and try our hardest to be the saint Pavles people look for to emulate; care for

others, put their needs above your own, and give to the less fortunate. Remember to put others first and to not look at the selfishness shown through the Kardashians to inspire you but instead the love and humility god, his saints, and his teachings portray.

Stewardship Update by Matthew Simko


Thank you all for a great Parish Assembly! As noted at the Assembly, 2022 was our most successful year for Stewardship in the history of the Church. That is all because of you!
