Dear Parish Family and Friends,

Christ is Risen!

One of my favorite hymns comes from the Katavasias of Pascha. It is the first ode and every time I hear it there is one word that comes to mind and that is joy. It is fitting that joy is what comes to my mind and heart because this is what our faith is all about.

The hymn says the following: "Resurrection Day! O peoples, let us brilliantly shine! Pascha, the Lord's Pascha! For Christ our God has out of death passed us over into life, and likewise from earth to heaven, as we now sing unto Him a triumphal hymn." Every part of this hymn expresses joy. It is joy in the resurrection. It is joy in the fact that Christ has passed from death to life. It is joy because as we proclaimed on Pascha, death can no longer harm us. This is what was preached throughout the world. This what all of our ministries here at the Cathedral must be full of, this same joy.

Father Alexander Schmemann once wrote that "Christianity has been the proclamation of joy, of the only possible joy on earth." The world may not always bring us happiness but Christians have joy because of what we just celebrated. Father again says that before we can do things with our "programs and missions, projects and techniques," we "must recover the meaning of this great joy." The work we do is not forced on us but it is done because we want others to know Christ. We want others to know that they are loved. We want others to know that in the world they may problems but Christ has overcome the world. We want others to receive the joy that we have.

My family in Christ, thank you for the joy you bring me. Thank you for proclaiming the joy of our faith through the work that you do. Let us continue the work that God has given us and invite others to receive the same joy that we have.

On Sunday, March 26, 2023 our Greek School celebrated two important holidays. One is the religious solemnity of The Annunciation when Archangel Gabriel announced to the Virgin Mary that she was God's chosen one to bring into the world His Son, Jesus Christ, the Savior of mankind. The other is a National one, when the Greeks, who had been enslaved by the Turks for 400 years, on March 25, 1821 revolted with whatever means they had, and after a lengthy struggle with the dream of Freedom or Death, they won their Independence. We should all pay our respect and gratitude to the Heroes who fought for the Freedom of Greece and glorified the Greek Nation. The 1821 Greek Revolution is a milestone for Hellenism and one of the most admired achievements of the Greeks.

The Greek Revolution may be over, but constant Vigilance is the price of Freedom. We pray today for our country and for Freedom-Loving People all over the World, and for a just and peaceful solution to the Cyprus Problem, which continues although the Republic of Cyprus in 2023 celebrated its 63rd year since its founding in 1960.

Two years ago, Greece celebrated the Bicentennial of Greek Independence Day. On March 24, 2023 we were honored with the presence of our Honorable Toledo Mayor Wade Kapszukiewicz and Toledo Councilman George Sarantou at the raising of the Greek National Flag at 1 Government Center with many Greeks and Philhellenes present, including AHEPA Ypsilanti 118 and DOP Dodona 24 members.

Our Greek School program began with the choir singing the Doxology and the parade of the Greek, American, and Cypriot Flags and Exapteriga held by Andrew Ellis, Daniel Ellis, Costa Matthews, Liam McCullough, and Jackson Simko, followed by the presenters. The choir led the singing of the Greek and American National Anthems. Thank you to Fr. Larry for then leading us in a prayer for the celebration.

Our warmest congratulations to Adult Greek School student Don Isenhath for informative speeches, in both Greek and English, about the Annunciation and the struggle for Greek Independence. We also thank Presvytera Jenny Legakis for identifying the many American Philhellenes who inspired those who made the Greek Revolution of 1821 possible. God Bless the United States of America! We thank our students who recited National poems in Greek: Vasilia and Lukia Legakis with «Το Κρυφό Σχολειό» and «Το Φεγγαράκι μου Λαμπρό» about the resilience of Greek Schools and of children during the years of Turkish oppression; and Jessica Williams with «Ο Θούριος του Ρήγα Φεραίου» and «Λίγα λόγια για την Μπουμπουλίνα» about the inspiring, patriotic words of Rigas Feraeus and of the heroism and sacrifice of Laskarina Bouboulina, the wealthy widow of a sea captain and patriot.

Thank you to George and Joyce Anagnos for their ongoing support to make Greek School remote learning through Zoom possible, to Gene Haberman for recording the program for the church YouTube channel, to Kristin Zink and Maria Tzanakis for taking photos, to the choir for their beautiful singing, and to everyone who made this program possible. Thank you to Fr. Larry, Parish Council, and the parish for their continued support for Holy Trinity Toledo Greek School.
