Year-End Report for Greek School 2022-2023, by Dawn-Avgi Anagnos, Instructor and Director.

It was another enjoyable and productive year in Greek School. We celebrated our School Year 2022-2023 on May 14, 2023 with attendance and participation certificates to the youth and adults. Our classes offer the opportunity to obtain endless knowledge about the Greek Language through reading, writing and conversation about all aspects of Civilization, Greek History, Mythology, Customs, Cooking, and Travel to Greece and Cyprus. More and more people desire to communicate with their relatives abroad and to prepare for the rigorous Ellinomatheia proficiency exams.

During this school year, information and registration for Greek School was posted on our webpage (https://www.holytrinitytoledo.com/greek-school/). In addition, Greek School information was available at the Greek-American Festival, at Ministry Sunday, in the annual mailing to the community for the start of Greek School and Sunday School, in email announcements, and shared via the Cathedral's social media. The classes are free to our church members and only \$100 for the full year for non-members, with a family discount option. Once again, Greek School presented three important Programs: (1) on October 30, 2022 the celebration of OXI! Day of October 28, 1940; (2) on January 29, 2023 the celebration of Greek Letters Day and the Three Hierarchs (St. Basil the Great, St. Gregory the Theologian and St. John Chrysostom), of January 30; and (3) on March 26, 2023 the celebration of Greek Independence Day of March 25, 1821 and The Annunciation. We are very proud of the youth, parents, and adults who presented at these Programs, which are also posted on the Cathedral's YouTube channel.

Since the pandemic, all Greek School instruction transitioned online via the Zoom platform. To our knowledge, Holy Trinity's Greek School is the only online church-sponsored Greek language program outside of the San Francisco Metropolis, and the Archdiocese Department of Greek Education makes referrals to our program when it receives inquiries for online instruction. This year we attracted students not only from the greater Toledo area, but also from across the United States, including Illinois, Michigan, Montana, New Jersey, New York, and Virginia. Beginner, intermediate, and advanced classes were taught over five 40-minute sessions on Wednesdays and two 40-minute sessions on Saturdays, plus additional make-up classes. Student enrollment is accepted throughout the school year, and lesson plans can be tailored to the student.




