

The President's Message by Kathy Chaka

It is now April, and we are midway through our Lenten journey. I hope you are finding pathways to a greater inner peace that truly comes from prayer, fasting, and reaching out and caring for others. I have to just begin by mentioning that recently, I was blessed to have attended a beautiful Lenten Retreat put on by our own Ladies Philoptochos Society. It was such an uplifting day, and everyone who attended went away with a feeling of having cared for others, while at the same time nurturing our own spirits as well. A special thank you to Presbyteria Jenny whose talk on "Peace and Repentance" was truly inspiring! It's moments like this, when we come together as a Parish, that make us all appreciate what a gift it is to be a part of Holy Trinity.

That being said, let me update everyone on the status of some of our current projects...

As they say, "April showers bring May flowers" and we are really counting on some good rains to let us know if all the work that is scheduled to seal the area of the roof above the arch, and the repair that was done to the end caps and flashing, will now allow us to move forward and finally complete the last of the repairs to the Cathedral; the wall by the Bishop's throne and the placement of the last icon on the pendentive.

If you were at the last Parish General Assembly, you heard that we are focusing our efforts now on creating a Maintenance Plan. Our goal here is two-fold: first we are looking to identify all the things in the Cathedral, and in the Educational Building, and on our grounds that should be on a regular Maintenance Schedule. Then, we will create a month by month, year by year schedule that we will follow. We have learned that ignoring regular maintenance has come at a price, and we are not going to do that anymore. Secondly, we need to put a dollar amount on all this maintenance so that in the Fall, when we are redoing the budget, it will be included in those figures.

As Festival Workshops quickly approach, I can tell you that we have reviewed all the quotes for the replacement of our current Cooler and Freezer and we have decided to go with Strause Refrigeration. Their bid was competitive and met

our needs. I'd like to thank George Sares, who was always by my side during the meetings with these companies, George Veronie for his invaluable help and expertise; especially, making sure everything we are doing is to code, and Vicki Rongakis for generously taking the time to create the concept architectural drawings that we have given to each contractor to use to make their bids. I'd also like to thank our restaurateurs, George Kyriakou of Charlies, Chris and Andreas Kamilaris of Georgios, Kyp Proestos, and Philip Dionyssiou of Rudy's, who helped me when I reached out to them looking for freezer and cooler contractors. Thank you so much!

In this time of Lent, I'd like to highlight a new ministry in our Church that has really been doing some amazing work, and that is our Outreach and Evangelism Ministry. We talk a lot about reaching out and being welcoming to new people that walk through the doors of our Cathedral. We stress how important it is to make them feel welcome. I am here to tell you that this is truly already happening at Holy Trinity, and this Outreach and Evangelism ministry is really making a difference. Thank you to Josh Lytle whose leadership and passion has made this a fast-growing ministry and to all those who are working with Josh to search weekly for any new face and welcome them with open arms.

I can't believe it was this time last year when we were preparing to walk into our newly renovated Cathedral for the first time. What a joy it was to experience that glorious moment together as a community! A lot has happened over the past year since then, and we can only thank the good Lord for continuing to watch over all of us and our beloved Holy Trinity!

The yarn was sorted, organized, and is now ready for use. **Let me explain more about our requests for yarn to clarify our needs.** There are two methods of giving: **1)** If you choose to purchase it from the store, we kindly request that you select 4-ply yarn in bright, cheerful, festive colors. **4-ply** is the type of yarn that works best for the twenty-five 7x9 inch crocheted or knitted rectangles needed to create our lap blankets. **2)** If you choose to seek out donations at rummage/garage sales or by on-line methods, we realize that these yarn contributions come in a variety of sizes. Due to this, we must separate the yarn sizes and organize what we can and cannot use. As a result, over time, **we have accumulated a large supply of yarn that is unusable for our purposes which is taking up much needed space in our storage closet.** So, Fr. Larry has suggested that we offer it to the community just like the books and videos were recently offered. When you see the yarn set out on tables in the Veronie Community Hall, please feel free to take what you want for yourself or a friend, or your child's school.

Whatever is left after the designated time will be donated elsewhere. **We are always grateful for your efforts in supplying us with yarn. Our cheer for the year is "Help us thrive in 2025!"** You are doing just that. **Please, keep up the good work!**

In March, **we were happy to donate four baby blankets** made with love to the Philoptochos sponsored Lenten Retreat Service Project which was a baby shower for the NORF-End Neighbors. May God bless the precious babies who will receive them.

Stewardship Update by Matthew Simko

The first quarter of the 2025 Stewardship Campaign has ended. For those who have pledged, you should soon receive your statement and big **Thank You!**

Last year at this time 146 Stewards made their pledge. This year, 140 have made their pledge. Additionally, by the end of 2024, there were 250 pledged Stewards. That means that between this time last year and the end of the year, more than 100 people or families filled out a pledge card or made their pledge online. The question I have asked the Stewardship Committee to consider is, why do some Stewards wait to make their pledge?

A pledge is the amount you, after prayer and consideration of God and His generosity, feel you can contribute. While a pledge should be an amount you feel you can contribute, it is not a contract. If, during the year, you determine you can contribute more or less, your pledged amount can be adjusted. That is, once you have made your pledge, follow the steps below to indicate an adjustment in the amount you will be contributing by the end of the year.

To be clear, a pledge at any time is a blessing. An early pledge, however, allows the Council to be more efficient with your contributions by knowing its true budget. It also allows the Stewardship Committee to focus on identifying new Stewards rather than putting resources into assuring those who intend to pledge do so. In short, by making your pledge now, you make your pledge go further and boost overall giving to our Church.

Making a pledge has never been easier. Below is a QR code that takes you directly to Holy Trinity's Stewardship Pledge Form. Using your smartphone, open the camera function and hold the camera over the above box. You will see the website www.holytrinitytoledo.com appear. Click on it with your finger on the link will take you to our Form where you can enter your pledged amount. 


